UNDERSTANDING THE SCRIPTURES

(Continued from last week)

We must 'rightly divide the word of truth' (2 Tim. 2:15) before we can understand it. We must learn what things apply to man today (living in the Christian age), and what things applied to men in other ages past and gone. What God spoke to the ancient fathers of the human race through the prophets was not intended for us today. "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son" (Heb. 1:1.2).

God does not speak to us today through Moses and the ten commandments, but through the voice of his Son, Jesus Christ. We do not live under the same testament as the thief on the cross. He lived under the Old Testament, we live under the New Testament (Heb. 9:15-17). We can search the Old Testament through and not find God's plan for saving men today. It is revealed in the new.

Christ himself lived and died under the Old Testament. "But when the fulness of time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law." (Gal. 4:4). We are not to live by the same law." (Gal. 4:4). We are not to live by the same law Christ lived by. Paul said, "For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death" (Rom. 8:2). Paul spoke of some who lived in his time who could not understand the New Testament because they tried to see it through the vail of the ten commandments "written and engraven in stones" (2 Cor. 3:6. 7, 15). Many have that same problem today. We can never understand the scriptures until we "rightly divide" them by relegating the Old Testament with its ten commandments to the age past and gone and coming to the New Testament to learn God's way of salvation for man today and how we should live to be pleasing in God's sight and how we ought to worship Him so that it will be acceptable to Him.


