He is survived by three sons, R. L., J. C. and Winston Curtis, all of Amarillo, a daughter, Mrs. Fay McManus of Amarillo; a brother, I. F. Curtis of Hedley; a sister, Miss Eula Curtis of Hedley; and four grandchildren.

Greenbelt Dam News

W. H. Cooke III has received a telegram from Lyndon Johnson that the bill to study the water resources of the Salt Fork of Red River had passed the Senate.

The bill had already passed the house. It will authorize the Secretary of the Interior to study the resources of the Prairie Dog Town Fork of the Red River as well as the Salt Fork. Estimated cost is \$165,000.00.

This bill should be a help to the Greenbelt dam and other similar projects. Coring of the river bed at the site of the Greenbelt dam will be started as soon as permission of all the property owners affected is given.
