As you know, if you watch network news at all, the networks don
always do the best job in portraying what actually is going on regarding a particular situation.
And, if you have read this column
for any length of time, you know that on occasion we have rapped the major networks for shortcomings in
regard to slants they have taken in
reporting the news. reporting the news.
So, in an effort
where credit is due, we salute
Charles Murphy and his ABC-TV crew, for the manner in which they
listened to the problems expressed by the farmers, and for seeing that
this was the theme portrayed by the filmed report.
Those familiar with the amount of film actually taken by the crew
while they were in Bovina marvelled
at how it relatively brief minute or two
contained in the network newscast.
But from what little we know But from what little we know about
filming for newscasts, this is
probably "average," especially for a network production. And, judging from what Murphy
told us while making the fifmed told us while making the filmed
interview on September 13, the local
segment made the airwaves in record time, considering that it was
more or less of the "feature" news mate ory.
So, at least the plight of the local area, which can no doubt be
duplicated virtually anywhere in the
farm belt, has been exposed on fapm belt, has been exposed on a
fational level. Whether or not it will have an impact on making changes
for the better, only time will tell. But be owe a big "Thank You" to
ABC Television News, for "giving a ABC Television News, for "giving a
darn." It is the type of response you
would expect on regional level. But to have received
such response on a national level is still a little bit surprising. They must have realized they might get a little
hungry if farmers are put out of business.

Commissioners OK New County Budget

Financial matters held the
spotlight during the regular meeting of the Parmer County Commissioners Court this past Monday.
Commissioners approved a budget for 1978 calling for expenditures of
$\$ 752,128$. This amount will be more $\$ 752,128$. This amount will be more
than $\$ 150,000$ less than a comparable figure of $\$ 902,713$ for 1977 . with the county clerk and the state comptroller, and can be inspected
by anyone at the county clerk's or by anyone a
judge's office.

## In other business, the commi

 sioners passed a resolution approving renewal of certificates of deposit in the amount of $\$ 60,000$ for one year, and also approved transfering
$\$ 40,000$ from the county's right $\$ 40,000$ from the county's right of
way fund, to be placed on certificate of deposit for a period of 90 days. The county's tax roll was
presented by Hugh Moseley, county tax assessor-collector. It showed
total valuation of $\$ 28,566,362$, and
and called for taxes in the amount of
$\$ 378,872.26$.
