Election Laws

The Informer this week received a letter from Mike McCully, new Democratic county chairman, outlining some changes in the election laws. Mr McCully takes the place of Mrs. Frances Cooke, who has moved out of the county.

Space will not permit printing the entire article this week, but among the essential points are:

The poll tax receipt now provides a space for party affiliation.

This space is filled in by the election judge at the time of voting, and only persons who have voted in the primary are eligible to take part in the conventions or hold a party office.

In Donley County voters who have reached the age of 60 are not required to obtain an exemption certificate in order to vote However, if they want to attend the party conventions, they must get a certificate from the election judge at the time they vote.

This time every voter is urged to bring his poll tax receipt to the voting place, as otherwise an elec tion clerk must fill out an affidavit that the receipt has been lost or destroyed.

And don't forget to pay your poll tax on or before Jan. 31.

February 15, 1960 is the final date on which farm owner or farm operators may file application for Group II (new growers) farm allotments for upland cotton for 1960 with County Committee.

April 5, 1960 is the final date for request for additional acreage from the released cotton acreage.

April 22 1960 is the final date for filing MQ 29, Release of Farm Allotments, for this district.

May 5, 1960 is the final date for reapportionment of released allotments.

All 1959 A C P approvals and 1960 approvals with the reporting date January 15, 1960 must be reported not later than Jan. 15th. If you have such an approval and did not get your work completed report what you have done and ask for assistance under the year program.


