Greenbelt Dam News

John C. Thomson, Assistant General Regional Director of the U S Bureau of Reclamation, Department of the Interior and J. C. Douglas, Area Engineer of Amarillo, visited the site of the Greenbelt Dam last week. With them were Mr. Collins of the Denver office, designer of dams, and geologists and field men.

Initial drilling of five holes is supposed to start the latter part of April. Something like ten more holes may be drilled if the occasion demands. There will probably be four more core drilling tests made on the river bed to determine sites for future dams, one to be near Wellington, one called Samnorwood site and one probably east and west of Clarendon.

Croppings of red bed show up in many places along the river bank and the geologists hope that a solid foundation can be located not too far below the surface.

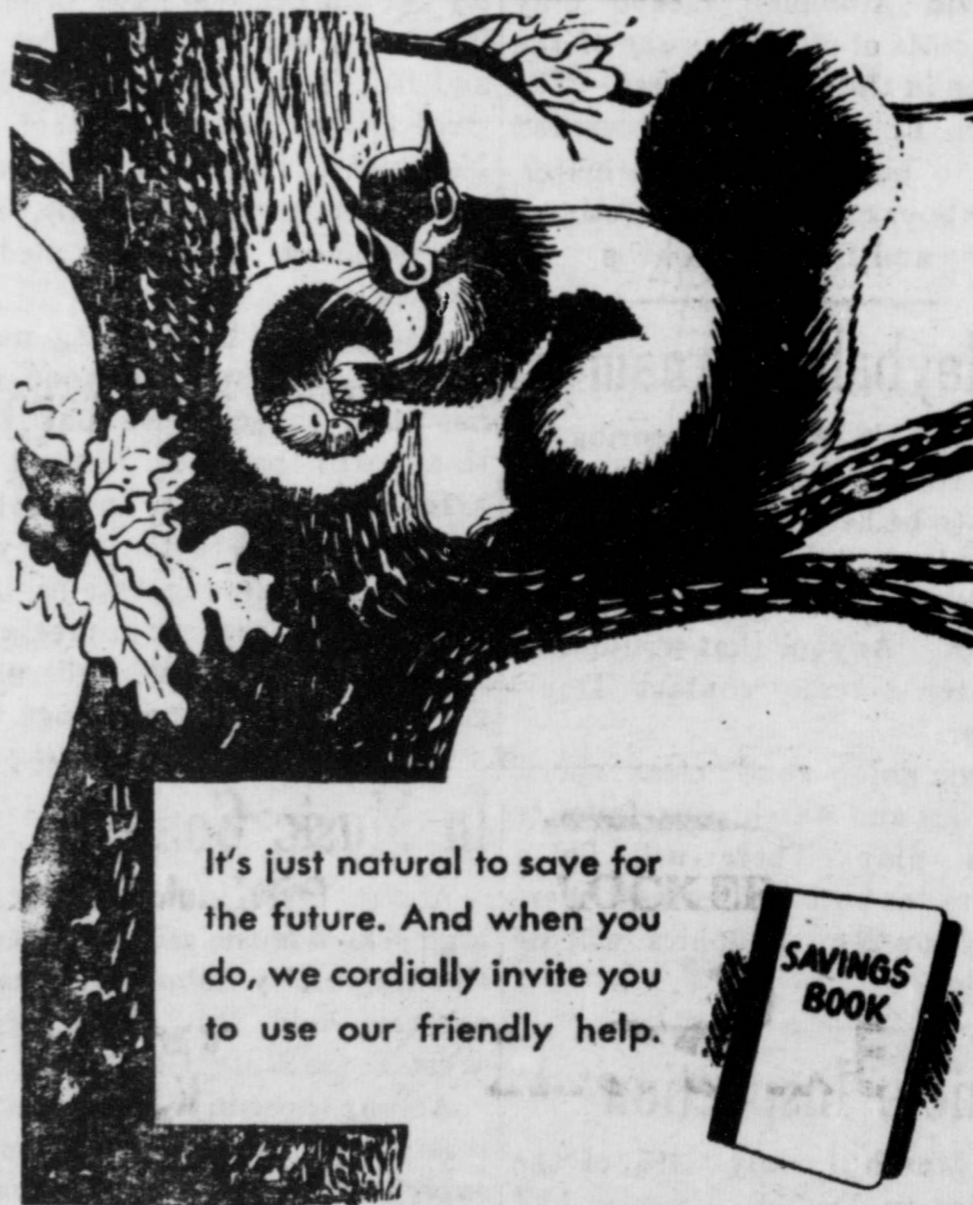

This is just another reminder that when cotton is plowed up, because too much was planted, adjustments credit shall be given only for acres of regular shape, with not more than four sides. One side or one end of the plow-up area shall be parallel with the rows or field boundary.

If you do not intend to plant your cotton allotment this year, it would be to your advantage to release the allotment. The County Committee can reapportion the acreage to other farmers, but only to those who will come to this office on or before April 22 and sign Form MQ 30 "Request for Additional Cotton Acreage"

April 22, Release of Farm Cotton Allotment

April 22, Request for additional Cotton Acreage from those released

April 30, Final date to file wool and lamb sales receipts.

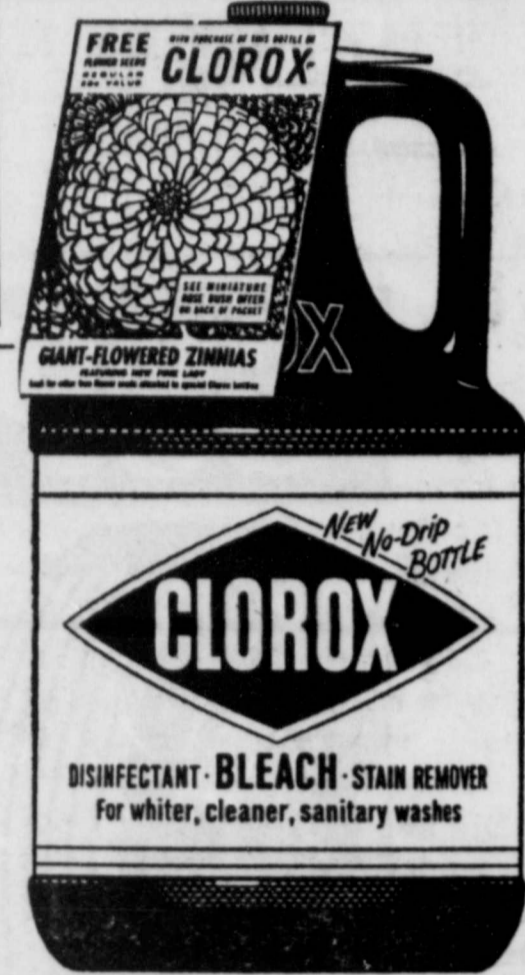
