## Greenbelt Dam News

Word was received from John Thompson acting Regional Director of the Bureau of Reclamation, U. S. Department of the Interior, Amarillo office this week in regard to the coring of the site of the Greenbelt dam. Mr. Thompson stated that eight bids were received for the coring contract and that the low bidder was the Engineers Testing Laboratory, Inc. of Houston, Texas, and they expected to sign the contract in the near future.

The contract calls for the drilling of five holes, varying in depth from 80 to 170 feet. In case the old river bed is not located by this drilling one or two more shallow holes may be drilled to locate it.

Permission has been granted by Guy Savage and W. J. Lewis, Jr. for the coring and it is hoped that the work will be started soon. The permission states that 120 days will be granted to finish the coring.

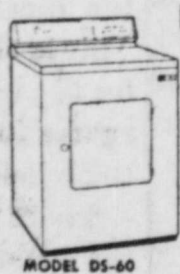
