

TO THE PEOPLE OF DONLEY COUNTY:

I challenge my opponent on his circular suggesting that he "BLASTS SALES TAX PROPOSAL" and "Casts Vote For Strong Lobbyist Law." The circular suggests that these articles were taken direct from a newspaper; if so, it is the usual custom to indicate or quote the source of the newspaper from which the articles were taken. Since these articles did not appear in any of the weekly or daily newspapers in District 88, I can assume that my opponent is trying to deceive the public by covering up what really happened in Austin. (Page 1852 in the House Journal shows that the incumbent voted to table an amendment known as the "Selective Sales Tax and Use Tax Act" and not that he voted against the sales tax as he would like to have you believe.) The record shows the incumbent voting AGAINST requiring members of the legislature to file sworn statements of money or gifts received from lobbyists. See page 229-230 (Nov. 5, 1957) in the Official House Journal; and it contradicts the information which the present representative is circulating in his campaign literature for a third term.


