## Attention Voters

There still seems to be a lot of confusion among some of our voters, especially our senior citizens, as to who can and cannot vote. Basically, there has been no change in the election laws relative to the requirements and qualifications of voters. Over-age voters are not required to get an exemption certificate in communities under 10,000 population, and I believe that applies to every community in Donley County. If you do not wish to attend the precinct convention, you vote just like you always did. Now if you do want to attend the precinct convention, simply ask the election judge to give you a certificate certifying that you have voted, and that is your ticket to the convention, but let me say again that if you do not want to attend the precinct convention, there is no difference in the requirements or manner in which you vote. For voters who are required to have a poll tax, they must either bring the poll tax with them or make an affidavit at the polls that same has either been lost or destroyed. It will expedite the voting considerably if you bring your poll tax because an individual affidavit has to be typed out for each voter if you don't.

Above everything else go vote, because that is one of the few privileges we have left.

## Awarded Fellowship

Canyon, April 26, (Special)—Mr. Connie R. DeBord, a teacher at Hedley, has been awarded a fellowship to attend the National Science Foundation Summer Institute at West Texas State College.

Dr. H. L. Cook, head of the W T mathematics department and director of the institute, said that each winner will receive from the foundation a stipend of \$75 a week plus \$15 a week for each dependent for the 12 weeks institute. The institute's work will parallel that of the regular summer term at WT, which opens May 31 and Aug. 19.

The institute is divided into two sections for mathematics physics teachers and biology chemistry teachers. Program will include classroom and laboratory work, seminars, field trips, and lectures by visiting scientists, including Dr. Willie Ley, noted authority on missiles and space travel. Field trips will include a visit to Holloman Air Force Base at Alamogordo

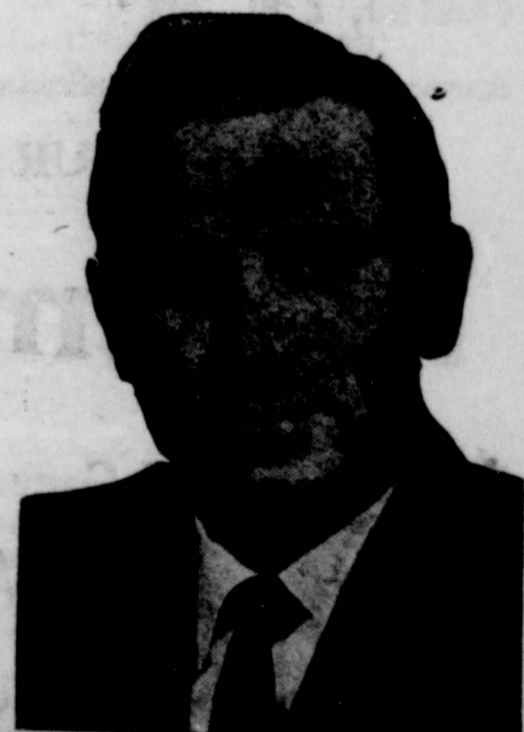
