Frank Kendall

Funeral services for Frank Kendall 85, one of this area's most highly respected pioneer citizens, were held Thursday morning from by Rev. S. A. Wolfe, Rev. J. S Tipton, Rev H. W. Cox and Rev Frank Story. Burial was in Rowe cemetery under direction of Spicer Funeral Home.

Pallbearers were Ross Springer, Henry Moore, Hobart Moffitt, Dr. D. H. Cox, H. H. Hall, Ed Boliver, Ray Moreman and Alfred Spalding. Honorary pallbearers included Walter Pierce, C. H. Noel, Bill Jones, Lee Everett and Bill Scales.

Mr Kendall passed away unexpectedly last Tuesday afternoon in a Memphis hospital. Up to a short time before his death, his condition was thought to be im proving satisfactorily after an operation.

Frank Kendall was born Oct 15, 1874, in Richie County, W. Va. He married Miss Ethel H. Woodward on June 20, 1904, at Dallas. The couple moved to Clarendon in 1904. He was a pioneer rancher Seniors Honored and printer, and was deputy sher iff at Clarendon in 1910. The couple moved to Hedley in 19I1 where he has actively engaged in all religious, educational and civic affairs. He was the first mayor of Hedley after its incorporation, and at the time of his death was serv ing his 21st year as Justice of Peace. He had operated the Ken dall Store, a general merchandise firm, for many years in Hedley. He was a member of the First Methodist Church of Hedley and was a church trustee at the time of his death. He was also an active member of the Odd Fellows and the Modern Woodmen lodges as long they were active here

He is survived by his wife, o Hedley; two sons, J. N. Kendall of Abilene and Chaplain Rex Ken dall, with the U.S Army at Fort Hood; two daughters, Mrs. J. S Hinds of Hedley and Mrs. Buford Hinds of Abilene; three brothers, the Rev. Joyce Kendall of Phoenix, Ariz., Will Kendall and the Rev. 
