Greenbelt Dam News Methodist Conference Open House

The core drilling at the site of the Greenbelt dam, after being delayed by rain is now progressing rapidly. The crew is working 10 hours a day seven days a week Formations have been found ac cording to expectations which are very favorable Without compli cations the operations should be completed within the week.

In fact about every report has been favorable. Quality and quantity of water has been tested for nearly four years and the reports have always been very good.

The recent tests on wells in the vicinity for water depth, forma tions and quality of water is also very good.

The report from the Texas Game and Fish Commission, who spent an entire year making the survey, wae that the lake when completed would be very productive and the fishing excellent.

The bed of the river is braided sand, quite different from the quicksands of the Canadian river The sand packs and makes a hard firm bed and the water will be clear except in flood stages.

Eighteen different types of fish were found among the 10,000 specimens taken from the river during the survey. Catfish were abun dant and five types of sunfish were found No rough fish such as carp were found above the dam site. Minnows were found in large numbers, in fact, according to the report, in large enough quantities for commercial bait seining. Summing up the report, Mr. Marion Toole, Director of the Inland Fish Division of the Texas Game and Fish Commission, says: "If plans to construct the dam materialize, fishing in the new lake should be excellent There were no rough fish found above the dam site and only two species were found below the dam site. All in dications obtained during this survey indicate the new lake will be very productive "
