Boys Ranch Rodeo

Two hundred sixty-one boys at Cal Farley's famous Boys Ranch are working hard every day to complete plans, preparations and practice for the biggest Labor Day event in the Golden Spread, the 16th Annual Boys Ranch Rodeo, September 4th and 5th.

All indications are that this nationally known rodeo will be the fastest, most competitive and thrilling the boys have ever had and in anticipation of a record-breaking attendance at the two day show, 1000 more seats are being installed.

Only Boys Ranchers will participate in the riding and special events and through a series of elimination contests, the top eighty riders will be selected to compete for points and prizes to be awarded under R. C. A. rules.

Boys from eight to eighteen will ride in calf, steer, Junior and Senior bull and bronc busting competition; the clowns and special attraction participants will be Boys Ranchers and hundreds of behind-the-scenes activities will be handled by the boys themselves.

Featured at both performances will be the military band from Amarillo Air Force Base, representatives from various riding clubs throughout the Panhandle and surprise attractions.

Both performances will be held on Sunday and Monday, September 4th and 5th, beginning at 2:30 each afternoon. Admission will be 75¢ for children, \$1.50 for adults and \$2.00 reserved section. Proceeds from the rodeo will go to help the Boys Ranch expansion program.

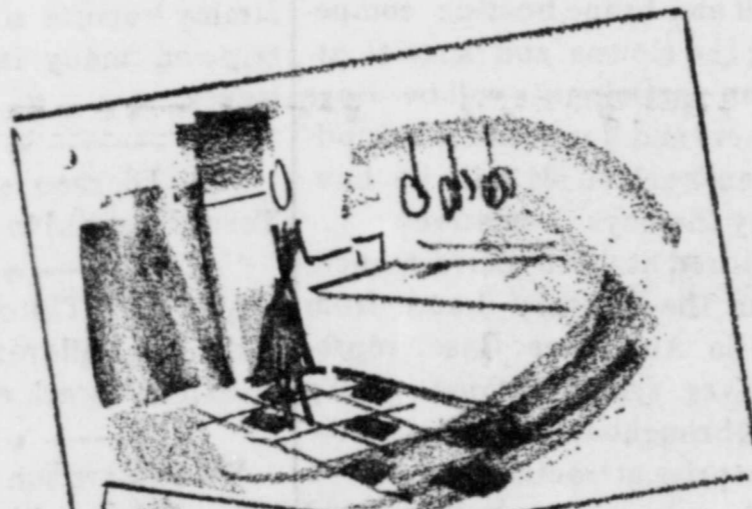

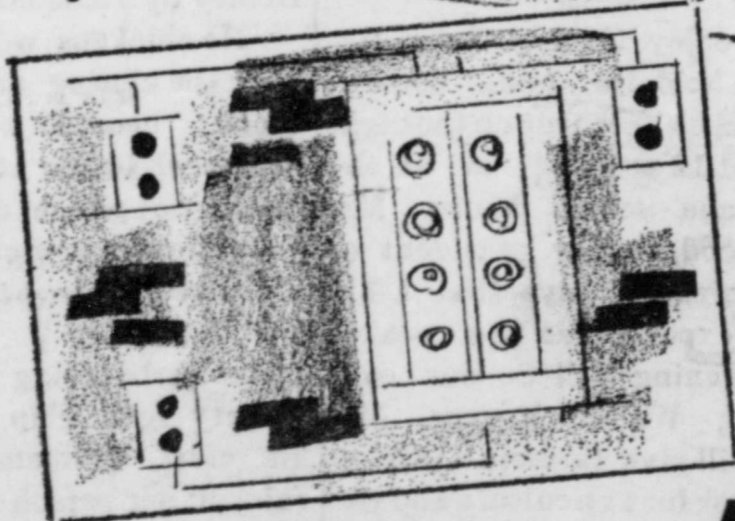

Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER TWO ON THE BALLOT

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 1960.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 6 proposing an Amendment to Section 49-b, Article III of the Constitution of Texas, increasing to three and one-half percent (3½%) the maximum permissible interest rate on bonds hereafter issued by the Veterans' Land Board; providing for an election and the issuance of a proclamation therefor.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 49-b, Article III of the Constitution of Texas, be amended by adding thereto the following:

"The foregoing notwithstanding, bonds hereafter issued by the Veterans' Land Board pursuant to the authority of this Section 49-b of the Constitution may bear a rate or rates of interest not to exceed three and one-half percent (3½%) per annum.

"This Amendment shall become effective upon its adoption."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held throughout the State of Texas on the first

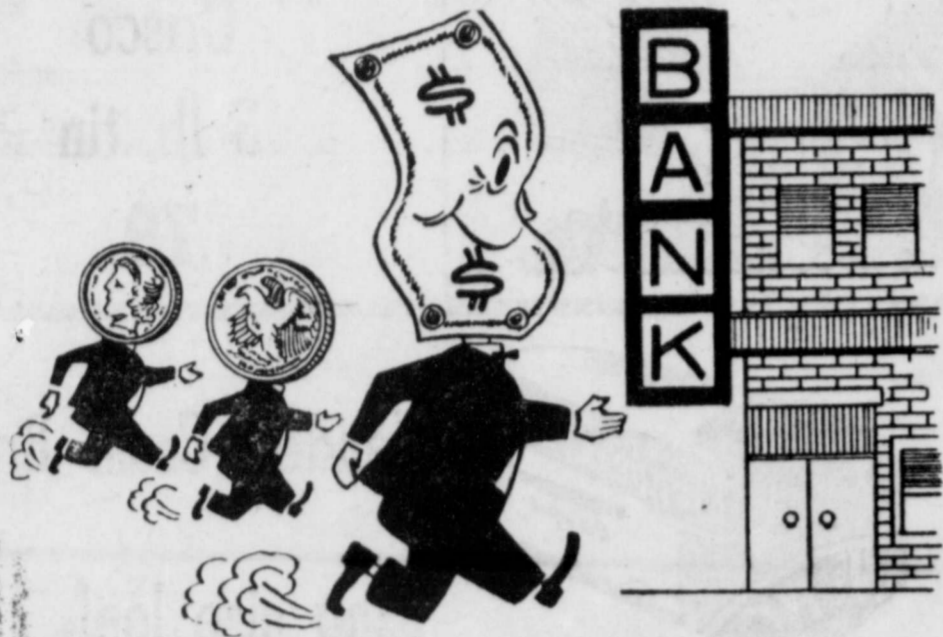
Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1960, at which election all ballots shall have printed thereon the following:

"FOR the Amendment to Section 49-b of Article III of the Constitution of Texas by adding thereto a provision authorizing the Veterans' Land Board to issue the bonds authorized under such Section to bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed three and one-half percent (3½%) per annum."

"AGAINST the Amendment to Section 49-b of Article III of the Constitution of Texas by adding thereto a provision authorizing the Veterans' Land Board to issue the bonds authorized under such Section to bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed three and one-half percent (3½%) per annum."

If it appears from the returns of said election that a majority of the votes cast were in favor of said Amendment, the same shall become a part of the State Constitution and be effective from the date set forth in said Amendment, and the Governor shall issue a proclamation in keeping therewith.

Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election, and shall have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of the state.

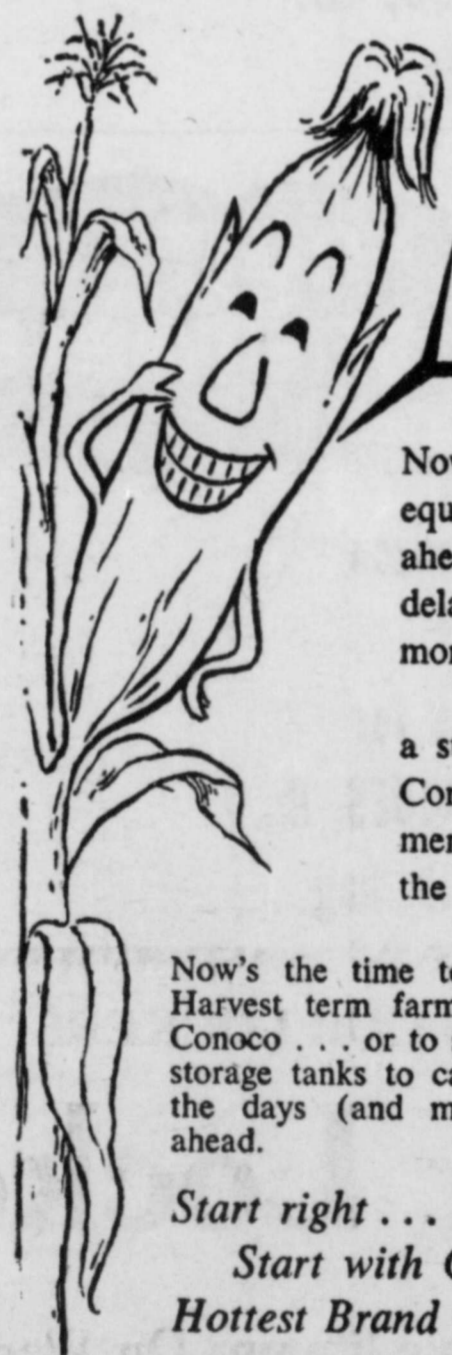

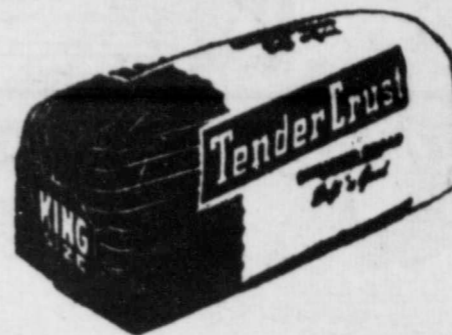
