Micah, one of the Old Testament writers, a man inspired of God, apparently did his work somewhere between 722 B C. and 690 B C In rich eloquence he describes the fall of Jerusalem and Samaria, the capitals and strongholds of God's people, saying 'Zion shall be plowed as a field and Jerusalem will be in heaps."

He attributes this forthcoming downfall to the forsaking of the teaching of God. This had brought about a corruptness of the government which abused the rights of the people openly, but hypocritically claimed to "lean on Jehovah." Micah wrote in this prophecy of a vision he had of the far distant future in which he saw the coming of the kingdom of God, saying 'the mountain of Jehovah's house shall be established --- and all the people shall flow into it," and that from Bethlehem should come forth one who would rule God's people

Like Micah of old, all through the ages, men of God have spent their lives teaching God's word and warning of the fate that awaits people who refuse to obey it. Even in "these last days" there are those who refuse the truth and deny that there can be a place of eternal punishment, but an honest study of the Bible, the only authentic information that we have from God, leaves no doubt as to the realness of burning destruction for those who fail to obey the commands of God.




