Merit Scholarships

All 1962 graduates of Hedley High School who wish to enter the 1961-62 National Merit Scholarship competition should register now at the school office, Mack Bush, Superintendent, announced today. The National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test will be given at 9 a m, Tuesday, March 7. 1961 (or Saturday, March 11, 1961)

To be eligible for the test, Hedley High School students must be second-semester juniors or firstsemester seniors at the time of the examination. Students must pay a \$1 fee on the day of the test. Any interested student who is unable to pay the fee should consult Mack Bush.

The tests are given each year by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation as part of the nation's largest independent scholarship program.

Awards are granted on the basis of intellectual merit, but student financial needs determine the size of individual stipends, which are renewable each year without further testing.
