# Farm Facts

Of course, farmers provide us with our daily bread, as well as cotton and wool for clothing, but they are making another contribution to the American economy that sometimes is not recognized.

Farming, measured by almost any standard, is our biggest single industry and is a major customer of other industries. This industry is getting bigger instead of smaller.

In 1959 the gross income of farmers was \$46.3 billion. This was 9.7 per cent of our gross national product for that year.

With that money farmers buy 6.5 million tons of steel a year-half as much as the automotive industry uses.

They buy more petroleum than any other single industry-more than one-eighth of all the petroleum produced in the country. They use more electric power than Baltimore,




