Hedley Ready For 9th Annual Cotton Festival

Cotton Festival

The Hedley Cotton Festival was started by joint operations of the Hedley Lions Club and Hedley Booster Club in the fall of 1952 It was designed as a celebration whereby the farmers and towns people of Hedley could show their thanks for the wonderful crops gathered here each year, by inviting the whole Panhandle into their town for two days of visitation, and fun. One of the interesting points of the affair is the town's desire to make everything at the festival free, as far as is possible. Barbecue, all you can eat for one dollar, and all merchants have co operated in selling at lowest possible prices during these two days

Continuous entertainment is of fered for two days and nights at no charge Bands, Parades, Choral Groups, Horse Shows, Magi cians, and many other entertainers perform. The spectacular each year is the two hour long coronation of the Queen of Cotton. Our festival events have been covered by Television, Radio and many newspapers In the eight previous Cotton Festivals, an average of 7,000 peo ple per year have enjoyed the hospitality of Hedley, a town of 500 population. It is today the Hedley Lions Club's principal activity each year. They plan months ahead, and try to have the speakers and entertainment that they think would like to attend, and that the people would like to have. This festival, the only one of its kind, is sanctioned by the National Cotton Council, who sends representative for the two day event. The festival committees promote the improvement of soil and the growing of better grades of cotton All types of agricultural products grown in the area are placed on exhibit. This is not a profit making commercial activity. It is Hedley's way of saying thanks for its good crops and good fortune.

Search On For 1961 Maid of Cotton




