

Drivers Warned

Speeding drivers and other traffic law violators will run a veritable obstacle course of highway patrol cruisers and radar speed checks during Christmas and New Year holiday trips this year when the Department of Public Safety holds "Operation Deathwatch"

"So far in 1960, Texas traffic deaths are below the number recorded at the same date in 1959." said Patrolman John Lowrie. However, in an effort to keep this grim figure to the absolute minimum, we have been ordered on a round-the clock duty to stop traffic violators during Operation Deathwatch."

Operation Deathwatch starts throughout Texas at 12:01 a. m. Dec 23 and runs through 11:59 a m. Jan 1, the Patrolman explained "All members of the Motor Vehicle Inspection, License and Weight and Safety Education Services will be added to the regular Highway Patrol staff in a determined effort to apprehend all traffic law violators," Patrolman Lowrie added.
