News From Our County Agent

The Donley County 4 H Club members made a good showing at the Sand Hills Hereford show this past week, says County Agent H. M. Breedlove. Eight steers were taken and competed among 180 Herefords from all over Texas.

In the middle weight steers Tracy Sanders of Hedley place fourth. His steer was not entered in the sale but will be carried on to other shows. Gene Floyd of Hedley placed seventh but withdrew his steer from the sale to go on to other shows.

Four steers were sold for a total of \$1972. The Donley County 4 H Club won first in the best display of steers from any county, and also won first in the breeders special, which consisted of three steers from any one breeder. The next show for the club is the Amarillo stock show, and Breedlove and his boys will leave on Friday, Jan. 20, for this show.

Greenbelt Dam News

Dr. S. H. Townsend has returned from a trip to Austin in regard to the interests of the Greenbelt Water Authority. There will be a bill presented to this session of the Legislature which will be to allow the State Water Development Board to loan up to fifteen million dollars to one project. Since the Greenbelt Water Authority will need only about ten million this will enable them to finance the entire project.

Mayor C. L. Johnson recently received a letter from Congressman Walter Rogers. Walter states that the U. S. Bureau of Reclamation is now working at top speed to get the exact location of the dam set so that we may proceed with the Hedley-McLean Highway and water contract elections. It looks as if our Congressman is on the job, as he has always been.

34,905 5 Acres In 1961 Conservation Reserve

A total of 34,905 5 acres of cropland in Donley County will remain out of production under Conservation Reserve contracts in 1961.

This land will remain in reserve under contracts entered into in earlier years of the program. It may not be cropped or used for grazing for the life of the contract. An annual payment is made in the fall of the year near the close of the cropping season, totaling \$297,854.89.

Land emerging from the Conservation Reserve because of contract termination may be kept idle for twice the number of years it was under contract without reducing future acreage allotments on the land. This is provided under a new law effective last fall, which ASC officials hope will encourage participants in the Conservation Reserve to keep former allotment crop acreage in vegetative cover after contracts expire.

National contracts expire on about 90,000 acres at the end of 1960, leaving approximately 28.6 million acres in the Reserve in 1961.

In the semi-finals the Owls defeated Adrian 56 to 40. B. Roland scored 25, B. Maddox 15, J. Dickson 3, R. E. Butler 5, J. Darnell 7 and R. Mosley 1.

In the finals of the tournament Hedley took the Stratford Elks by a score of 63 to 38. B. Roland hit for 28 points, B. Maddox 16, J. Darnell 9, R. E. Butler 7 and J. Dickson 2.

Bobby Roland and Bill Maddox were named on the all tournament team from Hedley.

The Owls after coming from the tourney have a 23 to 2 record. The Owlettes have a 17 to 4 record.

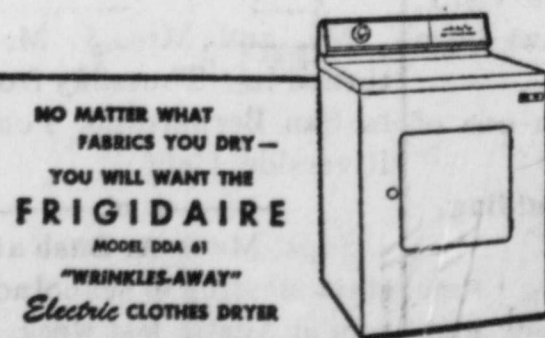

Highway Patrol Positions Open

The director of the Texas Department of Public Safety announced today 72 vacancies are available for qualified young men in the department's uniformed services.

Col Homer Garrison, Jr. said field service examinations will be given applicants at various locations over the State Feb. 14, 15 and 16. He said application forms and full information can be obtained at any Texas Department of Public Safety field office, or by writing to department headquarters, P O Box 4087, Austin.

Garrison said qualifications call for a high school education or the equivalent; height not under five feet, eight inches, nor over six feet, four inches; and weight not less than two pounds per inch of height nor more than three pounds per inch of height.

Applicants must be between the ages of 21 and 35.

He urged prospective applicants to get their applications in early, noting that the deadline for receipt of completed forms is Feb 10, 1961.


