## Locals Do Well at El Paso Stock Show

According to County Agent Flip Breedlove, Donley County 4-H Club members did a fine job of representing the county at the El Paso stock show. They took ten steers to the show, five Hereford and five Angus.

Tracy Sanders of Hedley had the grand champion steer of the entire show, bred by Tomie Potts. It weighed 867 lbs. and sold for \$230 per lb plus \$35 premium money, a total of \$2,029.10. Gene Floyd had a second place Hereford which weighed 878 and sold for 80¢, plus \$23 premium, a total of \$725.40. Darrell Holland had a fourth place steer which weighed 768 and sold for 60¢, plus \$19 premium money, a total of \$479.80. Besides the Hedley boys, Rod Stone of Clarendon showed the reserve champion Angus, Don Ray Mooring of Lelia Lake had a second place Angus and Susan McAnear of Clarendon showed a third place Hereford.

Three steers from Donley County will go to the Houston show later this month. Wayne and Beverly Leathers will take Hereford steers and Susan McAnear an Angus.

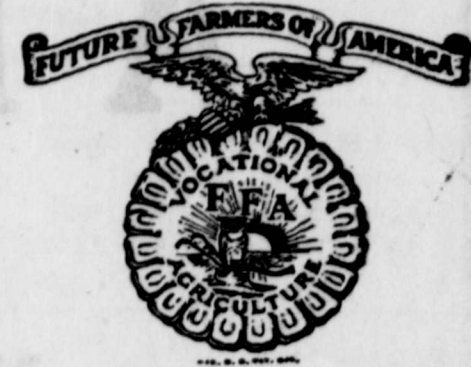

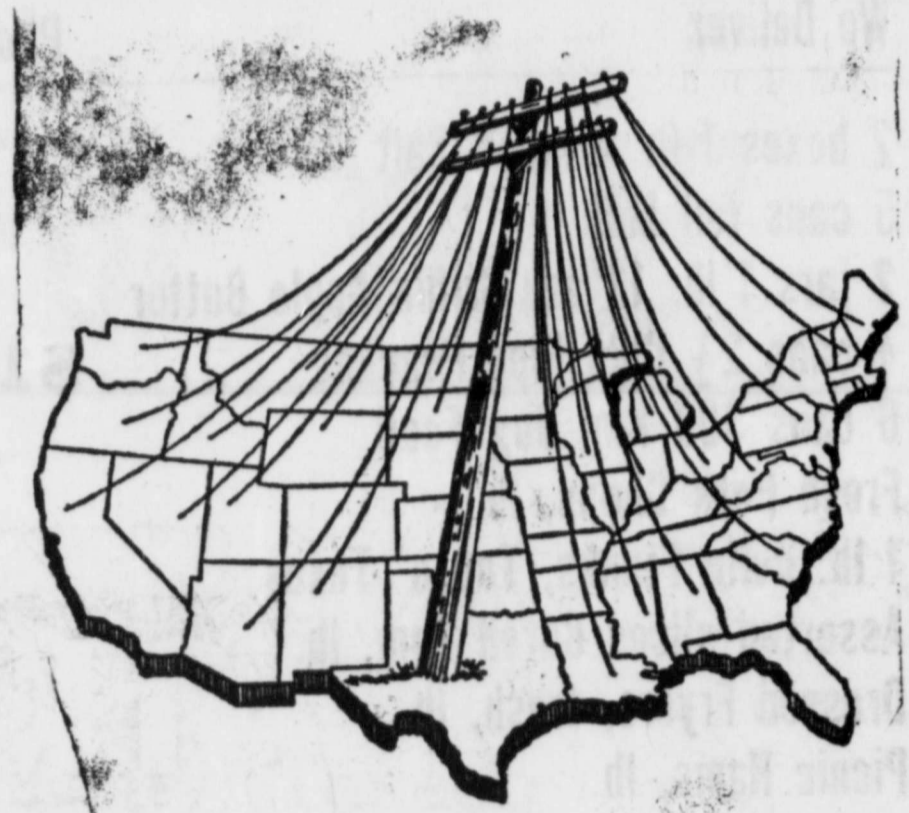

**New Car Tags On Sale | Clothing Needed**

State Highway Engineer D. C. Greer reminds Texas motorists that the renewal period for motor vehicle license plates takes in the months of February and March. The 1961 plates have black letters and numbers on a white background.

Greer stressed the importance of registering all vehicles in the county of residence, since the penalty for operating a vehicle without home-county plates is the same as for no plates at all. Also, a portion of all fees remains in the home county to benefit the local community.

Motorists are also reminded that they must take their certificate of title and their 1960 licence receipt when they go to obtain 1961 plates

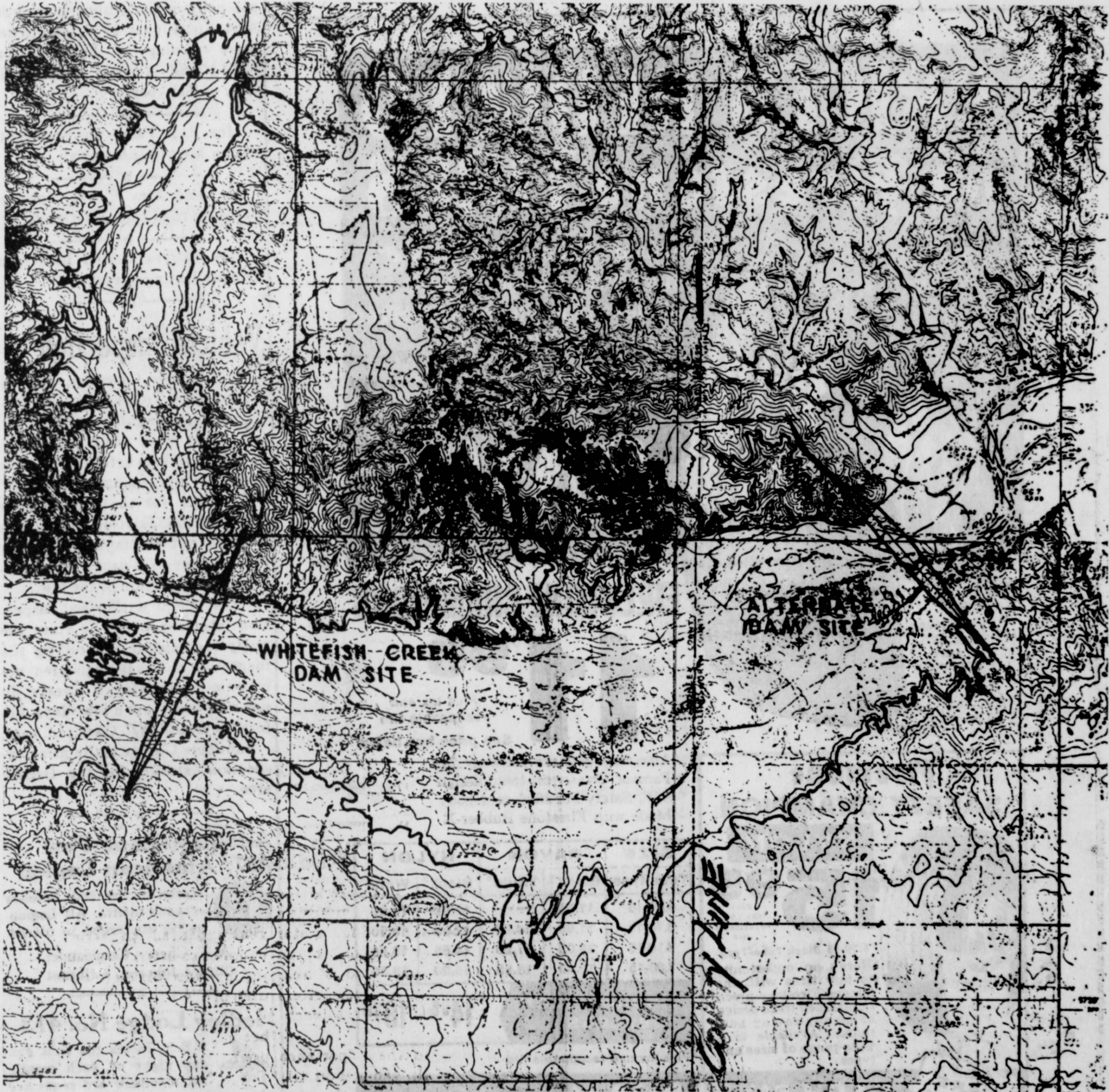

# Old and New Proposed Greenbelt Dam Sites Shown On Map



The old and the new dam sites of the proposed Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority are shown above. The old site is titled Whitefish Creek Dam Site. This site was abandoned when core drilling proved there would be no red clay onto which the ends of the earthen dam could be connected and eventually leakage would develop. The new proposed dam site, shown on the map as the Alternate Dam Site, is down river and in Collingsworth

County. The Alternate Dam Site has not been core-drilled but visible clay banks indicate a solid foundation for the dam. The old lake would have covered 4,690 acres and impounded 153,400 acre feet of water while the new dam, according to engineers, will cover 5,212 acres and hold 158,850 acre feet of water. The map shows that water impounded would back above the site of the Whitefish damsite.

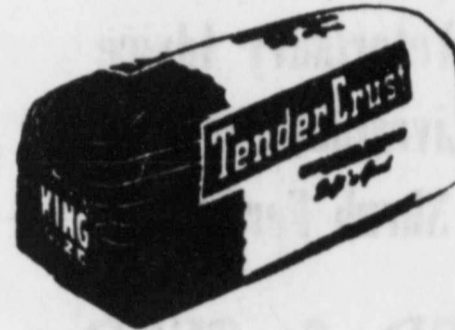
