William Ivan Jones passed away Tuesday, May 16, at St. Joseph's hospital in Houston after suffer ing a stroke the previous Thursday Funeral services were held Friday in the First Methodist Church in Hedley by Rev. S. A. Wolfe, pastor, assisted by Rev. J. S. Tip-

ton, pastor of the First Baptist Ohurch. Music was by the church choir and a special song, "An Evening Prayer," was rendered by H.E. Austin, a nephew of Mrs Jones. Burial was in the Clarendon cemetery under direction of Spicer Funeral Home.

Ivan was born Oct. 26, 1917 at Hedley. He was converted and joined the Methodist Church at the age of seventeen.
