A.S. C. News

Dec. 12 is the date set for the referendum on manketing quotas for the 1962 cotton crop, the Donley ASCS Committee reminds cotton growers. At least two thirds of the upland cotton farmers voting must approve the quotas if they are to be effective.

If marketing quotas are approved in the referendum, price support will be available to growers who comply with their 1962 upland cotton farm allotments at a level within the range provided by law—between 65 and 90 per cent of parity If quotas are not approved for the 1962 upland cotton crop, the allotment program will remain in effect, and price support will be available to cooperaterors at 50 per cent of parity, as provided by law

Under a quota program, growers who exceed their 1962 farm acreage allot ments would be subject to penalties of 50 per cent of the cotton parity price as of June 15, 1962 on the farm's excess production of the crop In addition, oone of the upland cotton produced on the farm would be eligible for price support.






