Enjoy Train Ride

The 1st and 2nd grades enjoyed their annual train ride to Memphis last Friday morning. The conductor showed them through the train, and they were met at Memphis by Police Chief Guy Wright and the Memphis Fire Dept., who gave them a ride to the Memphis park on the fire truck.

Only 197 votes were cast in last Saturday's primary election here. In the state races, Marshall Formby led the ticket for governor with a total of 96 votes; Preston Smith led for lieutenant governor with 91; Waggoner Carr led for attorney general with 93; Manley Head led for congressman at large with 82; Ben Ramsey led for railroad commissioner with 100; Evetts Haley Jr. led for commissioner of agriculture with 95. The state representative vote here was Saied 97 to Heatly 74.

In the county treasurer race Mrs. Ruby Hutton received 98 votes, Mrs. Walter Lowe 56 and Mrs. A. G. Lane 32; and all three propositions were voted against, No. 1 102 to 64, No. 2 104 to 57 and No. 3 83 to 72.

Over the county, Mrs. Hutton was elected county treasurer without a runoff, John Swinney and H. L. Riley entered a runoff for county commissioner from precinct 2, and Dick Chunn and Homer Estlack entered a runoff for justice of peace from precinct 2. Jess Finley was apparently re-elected commissioner from precinct 4.

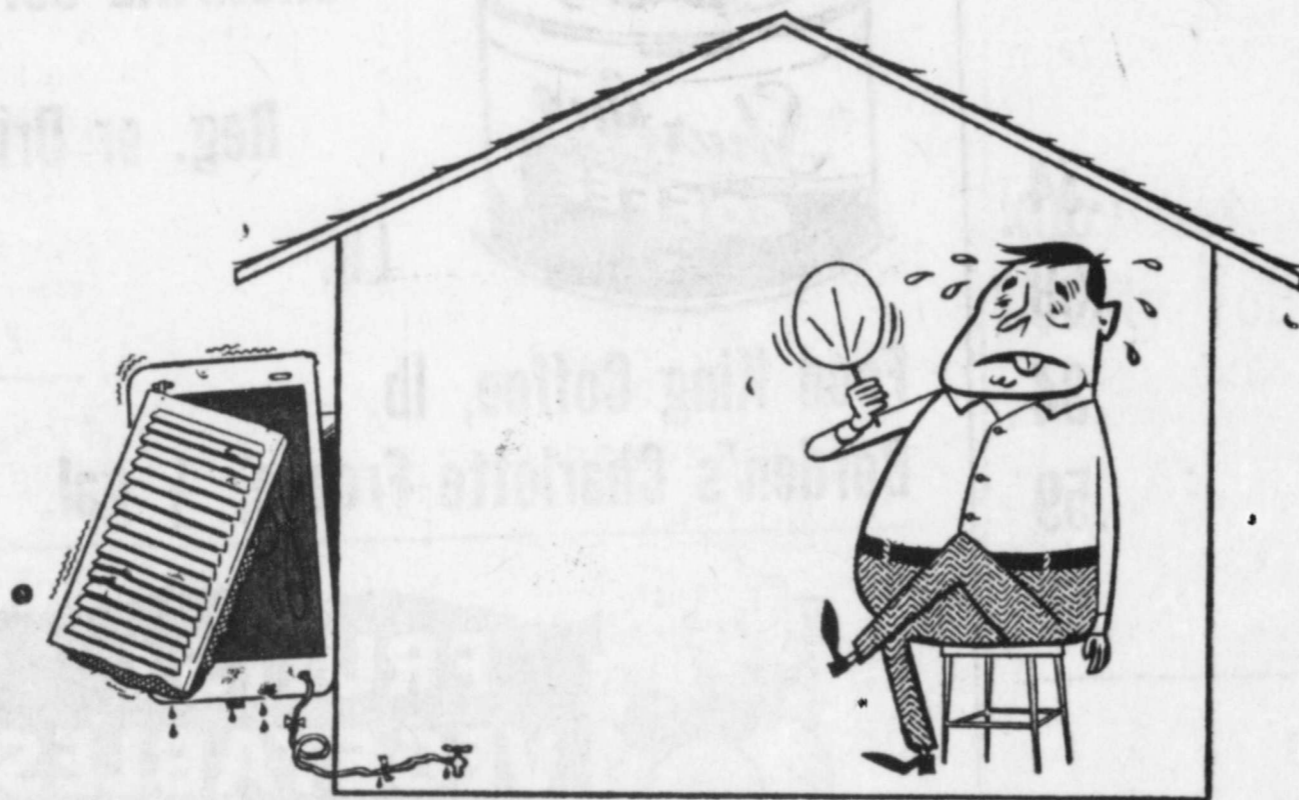

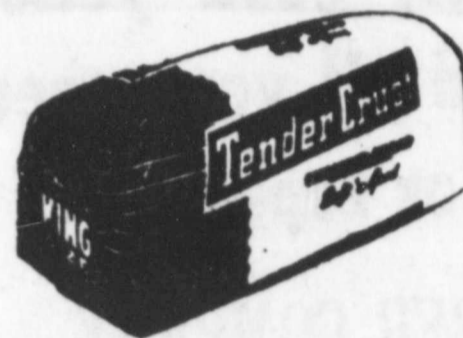
