and well regarded qualities of the State of Texas is its soundly built and carefully maintained highway system; and

Whereas, a consistent program of highway construction and modernization has in recent years brought about a reduction of more than 25 percent in the fatality rate on all Federal and State highways in Texas; but

Whereas, heavy increases in traffic endanger these advances in highway safety, since the state's population has increased by onefourth since 1950, the state now has more than five million registered motor vehicles, and the miles traveled by these vehicles now totals 43 billion miles a year;

Whereas, due to this flood of traffic some 22,000 miles of the state's 25,000 mile system of U.S. and State numbered highways are already obsolete for the loads of traffic they carry;

Therefore, Be It Resolved, as the Nation at large observes National Highway Week during the period May 20-26, 1962, that the Texas Highway Department be commended for its achievements in building today's fine highway system in the face of mounting traffic problems; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the citizens of Texas be urged to view with concern the adverse economic effects and the cost in human lives that will result if Holland, Leetta and Inelda Shields highway traffic overwhelms the capacity of our roads, and to support a sustained program of highway improvement and modernization to keep Texas growing.
