Whereas, due to this flood of traffic some 22,000 miles of the state's 25,000 mile system of U.S and State numbered higtways are already obsotete for the loads of traffic they carry;
Therefore, Be It Resolved, as the Nation at large observes National Highway Week during the period May $20.26,1962$, that the Texas Highway Department be cammended for its aehievements in building today's fine highway system in the face of mounting traffic problems; and
Be It Further Resolved, that the citizens of Texas be urged to view with concern the adverse economic effects and the cost in human lives that will result if highway oraffic overwhelms the eapacity of our roads, and to sup. port a sustained program of highway improvement and modernization to keep Texas growing.
