Boys Ranch Rodeo

A new rodeo arena and a record number of contestants is expected to attract the largest number of people ever to visit Cal Farley's Boys Ranch when the 300 boys now living there put on their 18th annual Boys Ranch Rodeo, Sept. 2 and 3, the Labor Day week end.

A total of 265 boys have registered as contestants in the nationally famous event that has become a Boys Ranch tradition. Although all of the boys who make their home at the Ranch will participate in some phase of the rodeo, only the best riders will be riding the professional rodeo animals that have been taken to the Ranch for the occasion. Boys from 5 to 17 will be competing for honors and prizes by riding calves, steers, Brahma bulls and bucking brones.

The Boys Ranch rodeo is the biggest Labor Day weekend event of the Golden Spread area. Performances will be held at 2:30 on Sunday and Monday afternoons. Admission is 75¢ for children and \$1.50 for adults. Proceeds will go to help the Boys Ranch expansion program.

Attention, Hunters!

Representative Heatly stated that in view of the fact the hunting season is fast approaching, he wanted to advise hunters of the new law that he caused to be enacted and passed during the last session of the Legislature.

It has to do with people who are unable to walk great distances and permits them to hunt from motor driven vehicles, so long as it is not from a public road. The law states as follows:

H. B. No. 733

"Article 901. Any person so incapacitated as to render self locomotion in pursuit of game hazardous to his health may, with a written authentication by a licensed physician of such an incapacity, hunt from an automobile provided no attempt will be made by one so incapacitated to hunt upon any part of the road system of this State."

Heatly stated that this new law will enable many people who are fine sportsmen to again go back to their love of hunting.

Mr. Floyd succeeds Clyde Slavin whose 3 year term expired this year. The other two members serving with Mr. Floyd are Thomas W. Bain of Hedley and Warren Hardin of Clarendon.

The local Farmers Home Administration county committee reviews applications by farmers and other rural families for six different types of agricultural, housing and water loans made in Donley County. In addition, the committee advises with the county supervisor regarding the adapting of national loan policies to local conditions.

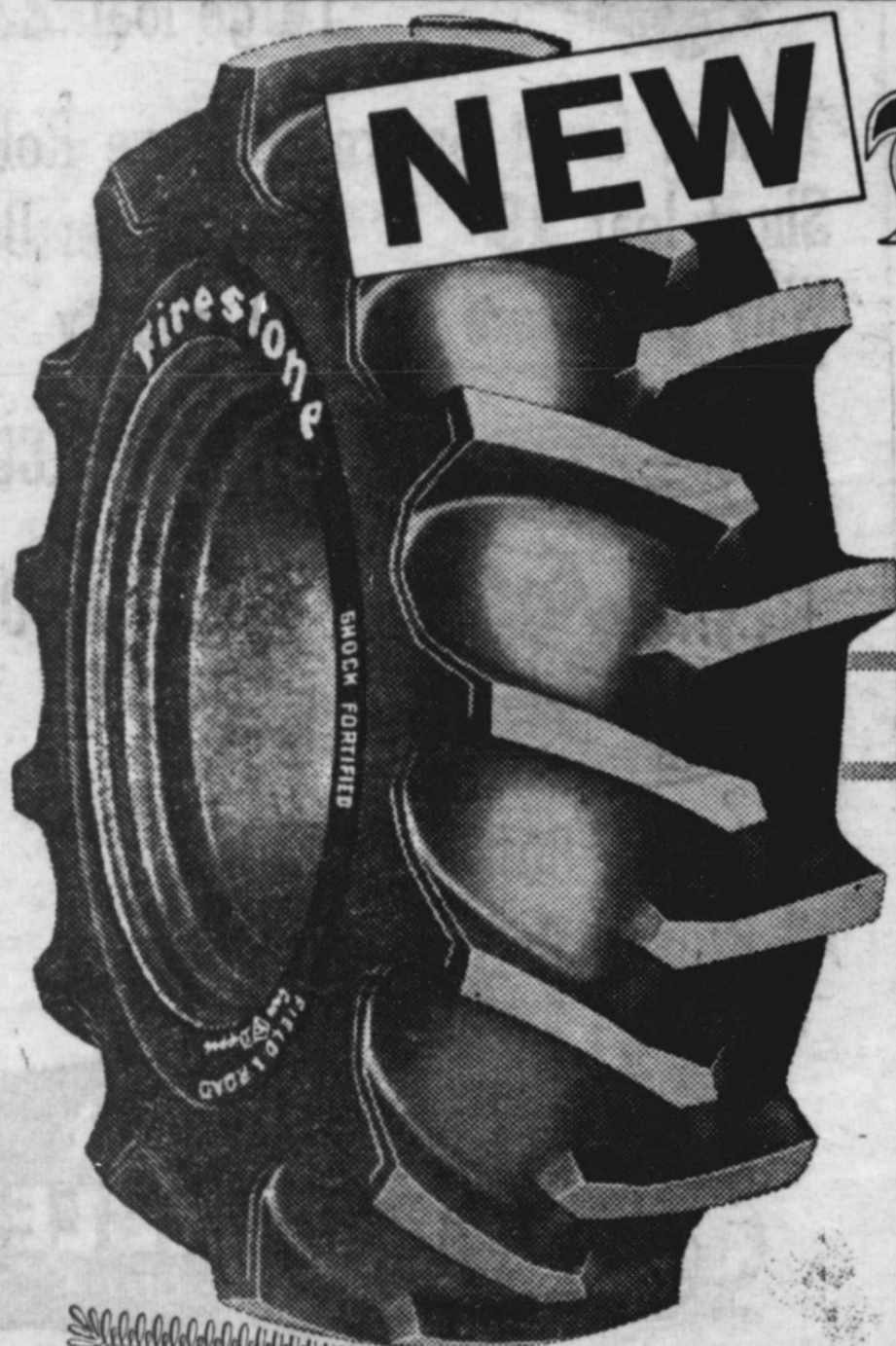

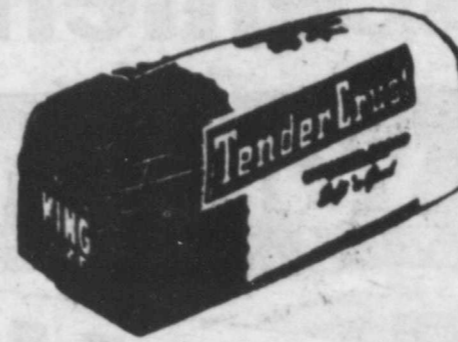
