Grazing Feed Grain And Wheat Diverted Acres

Beginning Nov. 1, 1962 most of the acreage diverted under the 1962 Feed Grain and Wheat Stabi'l program will be released from pro gram restrictions on grazing.

Diverted acreage on which grain or oilseed crops have matured in 1962, must not be grazed.

1963 Cotton Acreage Allotment Reduction

I am sure that you have already heard on the newscast where there will be a sizeable reduction in the cotton acreage allotment for 1963. We have not received an official notice to this effect but are of the opinion that the 1963 cotton allotments will be somewhat smaller than in the past year.

Soil Bank Program

Farms that have OR land that will expire at the end of 1962, may sign an agreement to extend this to do so. All the land on the farm with respect to which the conservation reserve contract expires on Dev. 31, 1962 is eligible except:
