Heatly Appointed

Paducah, Texas (Special) State Rep. W. S (Bill) Heatly of Padu cah became the second lawmaker in the history of Texas to be reappointed chairman of the appro priations committee.

Heatly was named chairman of the state appropriations committee Thursday by House Speaker Byron Tunnell.

Heatly was chairman of the ap propriations committee in 1959 when Waggoner Carr was speaker of the house.

Only one other person in the history of Texas has served as chairman of the appropriations committee more than once. He is Max Smith of San Marcos, who actually held the post three terms. 1953, 1955 and 1957.

The appropriations committee handles every dollar spent by the State of Texas and its chairman automatically becomes a member of the legislative budget board

Heatly is beginning his fifth two year term in the House. He stands 10th in line of seniority in the House of Representatives.

In addition to the appropriations committee, Heatly also is vice chairman of the judicial districts committee and a member of the banks and banking, insurance and labor committees.

The 82nd district includes Cottle, Motley, Foard Wilbarger, Hardeman, Childress, Hall and Donley Counties.

Monday night Jan. 28, 7:00 p. m has been set for the enrollment of students from the Clarendon Junior College area in the second semester of the adult education on night school program. This announcement was made by Oriver J. Abel, Dean of the College and Director of the night school. The following courses will be offered during the spring semester of the night school program when a sufficient number of students have been enrolled to justify the class. in most cases this number will be set at a minimum of 10 students. With the exception of classes in Bible, Oil Painting, and General Chemistry, the night upon which each of the classes will meet will be determined by the students in each class at the first regular session. Bible 137, (Life and Teachings of Jesus) and Oil Painting will meet on Monday night. General Biology will meet on Tuesday night.

In addition, the following classes will be offered: Beginning Typing, Intermediate Typing, Beginning Shorthand, Intermediate Shorthand Bookkeeping and Accounting, Arts and Crafts-Creative Hobbies, Government 223 (State), American History 213, General Chemistry, General Physics, Business Math, Business Law, English 113 (Composition and Grammar).

All classes will meet one night weekly. The length of the class session is determined by the semester honr value of the course. For example, three hour courses will meet from 7:00 to 9:40 one night weekly.




