Greenbelt Dam

The directors and engineers of the Greenbelt Water Authority met with the City Councils of Quanah, Childress, Paducah, Hed ley, Memphis and Clarendon last Thursday and Friday.

The meeting with the local council was held in the community room of the bank and was well attended Both Col Si Freese, senior member of the engineering firm of Freese, Nichols and Endress of Fort Worth, and Dr. S H. Townsend of Childress, President of the Authority, commented on the enthusiasm and interest of

the Hedley citizens The dam can be financed with only the key cities of Quanah, Childress, Hedley and Clarendon without an increase in taxes or water rates even if the other cities do not choose to buy water from the Authority. Since no taxes are involved and the cost will be paid by the revenue received from the lake only one election will be needed. This will be to vote the water contract between the cities and the Authority and will be held in the interested cities on the same date, probably in August.






