News From Our County Agent

County Agent Flip Breedlove announced today that the first confirmed case of screwworms was located 81 miles south of Hedley last Saturday. The sample was found by Earl Wheatly and was sent to the screwworm eradication program at Mission, Texas.

Monday morning a representative of the eradication program arrived in Breedlove's office and 27, 1890. Mr. Cline and one went to the ranch to mark the location so that sterile flies can be dropped by plane. Mr Chaney, for 15 years the program representative, said that in 48 hours from the time that the case of screwworms was confirmed and the spot marked, sterile flies would be dropped in the area. The number of flies dropped will be sufficient to cover an area of about seven miles square.

Breedlove is urging all livestock owners in the county to be on the lookout for screwworm cases and to immediately put eight or ten worms in a container and ship to the Screwworm Eradication Program, Box 969, Mission, Texas Containers for shipping can be secused at Breedlove's office and no postage is necessary. Be sure to fill out the papers enclosed with the shipment so that the location of the case can be identified on map for dropping o sterile flies.


