Clifford Johnson, Hedley representative on the Greenbelt Water Authority, attended the meeting held at Childress last Friday night. Also in attendance besides the directors were two members of the Authority's attorneys, two from the engineers, a group from Crowell and press agents from the Childress Index and the Quanah was in Rowe cemetery under di-Tribune Chief.

The Crowell delegation requested that the Authority's attorneys take the necessary steps in order that they might vote to come into the Authority.

A recent survey showed the district was using more water than 1997 at the time of the last survey This will enable the Authority to out the initial rate from 35¢ to 30¢ for filtered water delivered in our overhead tank.

The State of Texas, Dept of Health, bas approved the water supply for the district. The water will have a hardness of 160 parts per million. Last test on Hedley water taken June 19 showed 208 parts of hardness, which is the softest water in the district.

The attorneys read a draft of the water contracts on which the public will vote. They plan to have everything in readiness for August voting in all cities of the district.

The directors will meet again in about 10 days and employ a fiscal agent

Var County Agent

Donley County livestock producers are now on the lookout for screwworms in livestock, says county agent Flip Breedlove. Six confirmed cases of screwworms have been found in Donley county so far and all have been south of the river in the county.

Speneer Sitter, chairman of the Animal health committee of the county, and Joe McMurtry, vice chairman, and Flip Breedlove and Dr. C E Deyhle attended a screw worm meeting in Abilene last Friday afternoon. In the meeting all livestock producers are urged to send in worm samples of any found in livestock. If they are screwworms, then sterile flies will be dropped in the vicinity of the case of worms. This will not be done unless a sample of worms is sent to the Mission office.

Breedlove has containers in his office, addressed and ready to mail. Fill out the sheet inside of the container and just drop in the post office, no postage is necessary.

It is important that samples to be sent in so that sterile flies will be dropped in the county. A good spray program is necessary where it is possible and will help to con trol the screwworms Breedlove says that anyone needing containers to ship worm samples can get them in his office, there are plenty on the desk so help yourself if he is not in the office. It would be a good idea to call the county agent or drop him a card if you ship in a sample and he will be on the lookout for the report.


