




#### **4** Accidents In July

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated four accidents on rural highways in Donley county during the month of July, according to Sergeant J. W. Wilson, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area

These wrecks accounted for two persons injured and property damage in the estimated amount of \$2 155.00

The rural traffic accident summary for this county from January through July of 1963 shows a total of 19 crashes. As a result of these crashes there were one person killed and 11 persons injured. The estimated property damage amounted to \$13,843 00.



Enlarged to accomodate a second number of visitors, the rodeo arena at Boys Ranch will have reserve box seats for the first time this


**Boys Ranch Rodeo** 

year. This diagram indicates the three box sections that have been added to the arena, providing more than 500 front row seats for spectators.



## A.S.C. News

Farmers in Donley County are reminded that community elections of Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation farmer-committeemen will soon be taking place.

A farmer will be eligible to cast a ballot for the men he wants to represent him on the committee if he is participating or is eligible to participate in one or more of the national farm programs administered locally by the farmer-committeemen Such a person is eligible to vote in the committee election if he or she is of legal voting age and a farm owner, tenant, or sharecropper, or, if not of legal voting age, in charge of the farming operations on an entire farm.

Programs administered by the ASC County and Community committees include the Agricultural Coaservation Program, acreage alloments, marketing quotas, commodity loans, the Feed Grain Program, the National Wool Program, farm storage facility loans, and others as assigned by the Secretary of Agriculture.

In Donley County, the elections will be held by mail on September 12, 1963. Votes will be tabulated publicly on September 17, 1963. The elections will choose three community committeemen and two alternates.


