





April 15 is the deadline for having your 1964 inspection sticker on your vehicle. Only half of the vehicles in Region 5 of the Texas Dept of Public Safety have their 1964 stickers, according to Capt. Alan Johnson, Motor Vehicle Inspection Service of the D. P S.

"Residents of Donley County own 3.012 registered vehicles and 1.600 have not been inspected as yet," Johnson said

"Under the law there can be no extension of the deadline, and

motorists who fail to display the new sticker on and after April 16 are subject to arrest," he said.




