Alvin W. Atkinson

Funeral services for Alvin W. Atkinson, 90, who passed away Thursday of last week in Texarkana, were held Saturday in the Hedley Methodist Church by Rev. Wilton Lynn. Burial was in Rowe cemetery here.

Mr. Atkinson was a pioneer settler in Collingsworth County, coming there from Alabama in 1893. He taught at the first school in Quail in 1903 and 1904, helped organize the Quail Methodist Church and served as justice of peace. He moved to Hedley 13 years ago.

He was born July 16, 1873 in Alabama, and was married to Miss Lillie Bell Sanford at Anniston, Ala., on Jan. 22, 1919. Mrs. Atkinson passed away in 1961.

He is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Donald Hughart of Oklahoma City; two sons, A. W. Jr. of Texarkana and Orville of Plainview; and five grandchildren.

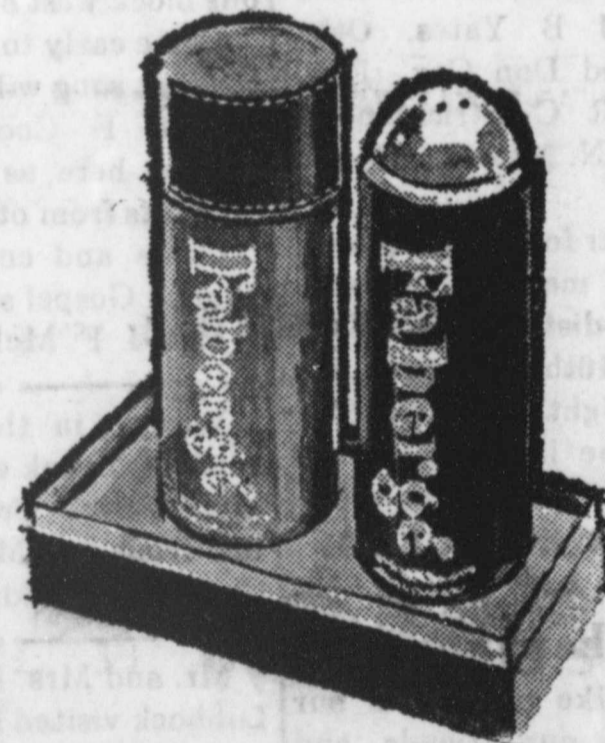

News From Our County Agent

County Agent Flip Breedlove says that the time fast approaches to be on the look out for screw worms. We had a wonderful year last year with very few cases reported in Donley County. Breedlove says that this was due a great deal to the cooperation of all livestock owners in spraying of cattle and when they did find a case of screw worms, the sample of worms was sent to the Mission, Texas laboratory at once.

Containers for shipping in samples of worms when they are found are available in the office of the county agent. All livestock owners who do not have a container should drop by the county agent's office and get some before the screw worm time arrives.

Breedlove also asked that all livestock owners who find worms in livestock wounds let him know when the samples are mailed out. It is understood that sterile flies will be dropped in infested areas again this year.

Vehicle Inspection

April 15 is the deadline for having your 1964 inspection sticker on your vehicle. Only half of the vehicles in Region 5 of the Texas Dept of Public Safety have their 1964 stickers, according to Capt. Alan Johnson, Motor Vehicle Inspection Service of the D. P. S.

Residents of Donley County own 3 012 registered vehicles and 1 600 have not been inspected as yet," Johnson said.

Under the law there can be no extension of the deadline, and motorists who fail to display the new sticker on and after April 16 are subject to arrest," he said.
