Primary Election

Much interest was shown in the first primary here Saturday, 496 votes being cast. Local races were the primary concern.

For Commissioner, Junior Hill received 212 votes, Frank Murray 165, Woodroe Farris 62 and A. G. Alexander 50. With the Lelia Lake vote added the totals were Hill 267, Murray 194, Farris 71 and Alexander 64.

For Sheriff the count here was Behrens 225, McPherson 110, Cornell 87 and Yankie 27. Incomplete county totals showed Cornell 742, Behrens 588, McPherson 180 and Yankie 164.

For County Attorney Hedley gave Slavin 251 and Lowe 196. The county, incomplete, showed Slavin 778 and Lowe 414.

For District Judge Hedley gave Harp 220 and Reynolds 197. The district total was Reynolds 5 505 and Harp 4 319.

For State Representative, Hedley gave Heatly 258 and Thomas 119. The district total was Heatly 10,686 and Thomas 5,510.

For County Chairman Hedley gave Johnson 323 and Cooke 107. Miss Cooke won in the county, but we did not learn the vote.

Congressman Walter Rogers, District Attorney John R. Gillham, School Supt. Ruth Richerson, Justice of Peace M. O. Weatherly, and Precinct Chairman Henry Moore were unopposed.

For Governor John Connally led in Hedley with 271 to Don Yarborough 135. For Senator Ralph Yarborough led Gordon McLendon 257 to 137. For Railroad Commissioner Jesse Owens led Jim Langdon 192 to 153. For the Court of Civil Appeals Ernest Northcutt led Herbert Martin 231 to 128.

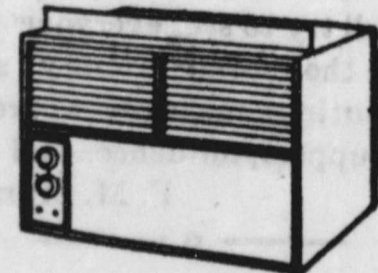

News From Our County Agent

County Agent Flip Breedlove says that the time fast approaches to be on the look out for screw worms. We had a wonderful year last year with very few cases reported in Donley County. Breedlove says that this was due a great deal to the cooperation of all livestock owners in spraying of cattle and when they did find a case of screw worms, the sample of worms was sent to the Mission, Texas laboratory at once.

Containers for shipping in samples of worms when they are found are available in the office of the county agent. All livestock owners who do not have a container should drop by the county agent's office and get some before the screw worm time arrives.

Breedlove also asked that all livestock owners who find worms in livestock wounds let him know when the samples are mailed out. It is understood that sterile flies will be dropped in infested areas again this year.

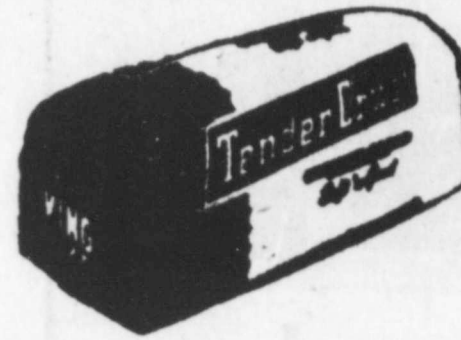
