

Agriculture Census


The 1964 Census of Agriculture, now being conducted by the Bu reau of Census, U S. Department of Commerce, in Donley County, will bring up to date the farm and ranch statistics last collected in 1959

Here are a few of the many facts recorded in the 1959 agriculture census for this County:

There were 450 farms and ranches in 1959, compared with 619 in 1954. The average size of farm and ranch was 1,0379 acres in 1959, compared with 8128 acres in 1954.

The value of products sold by the Connty's farmers and ranchers in 1959 was \$5,980,335 The value of all + crops sold was \$2,272,336 The value of all livestock and livestock products sold was \$3,707,999.

The 1964 national Census of Agriculture is the 18th in a series which began in 1840. Because of the rapid changes American agriculture has been undergoing in recent years, Census Bureau officials regard the current census as one of the most significant ever taken They ask every farmer and rancher to cooperate in compiling an accurate record of these by filling out the census form he receives in the mail and holding the completed questionnaire until a census taker calls for it.

Cotton Referendum

The USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service in Memphis, Texas production of upland cotton reported that cotton classed for growers during the week ending Friday, Dec 4, was again lower in grade, staple length, and micronaire readings than in the preceding week The weather and the method of harvesting accounted chiefly for the lower quality

K E Voelkel, in charge of the Memphis Classing office, stated that sample receipts during the week were the largest of any week this season Through Friday total of 18 000 were classed bringing the seasonal total to 45,000 samples This compared with 94,000 a year ago as of the same date.
