The emergency program for grazing and-or haying soil bank acreages has been extended until April 30, 1965. The grazing and haying rates are the same.

Producers will not be permitted to graze CR acreages to such an extent as to destroy the cover.

If you intend to graze or hay your soil bank land be sure to come to the office and sign an application for approval of the County Committee to do so.

Substitution for Wheat and Feed Grain

If you plan to substitute either wheat for feed grain or feed grain for wheat, be sure you fully under-

stand the substitution provisions. If you haven't talked with us about this matter, be sure to do so before May 1
