Changes in the Cotton Loan Program

The USDA has appounced changes in the cotton loan program to make the program more convenient for cotton producers and less costly to CCC. Beginning with the 1965 crop of cotton. all loans will be disbursed by the ASCS County Offices only in the past, loans could be disbursed by lending agencies also.

Under the new procedure all loan notes executed by producers, warehouse receipts, and all related documents will remain in custody of ASCS county offices until loan maturity or redemption This will make it possible for producers and persons who purchase loan equities to redeem cotton from the loan easier and quicker because redemptions can be accomplished at county offices In the past, all

loan documents have been maintained at the ASCS Commodity Office in New Orleans.


