Domestic Cotton Allotment Program

Where an agreement to participate has been filed and the farm does not comply with the provisions of the program any adwance payments must be refunded with 20. 6% interest If the domestic cotton allotment is exceeded the farm will not be eligible for CCC price cotton crop. Any farm that ex- 21. ceeds its feed grain base even, though it stays within the domestic allotment price support payment but will be eligible for the CCC loan on the cotton Any farm with an effective allotment of 15 acres or less and is automatically in the Domestic Allotment Program is not required to stay within its feed grain base.
