A bombing raid can be produced so realistically that one can almost see it. With his unusual electronic setup Mr Ramsden can demonstrate frequencies too low or high to be heard.

It is possible to play the melody, harmony, base and other musical parts at the same time on the Novatar. The stylings range from folk tunes to classical music with really unique interpretations throughout.

Hedleyans are urged to come out and hear this unusual musical program on a really unique instrument.

About 30 persons from Hedley were in the studio audience.

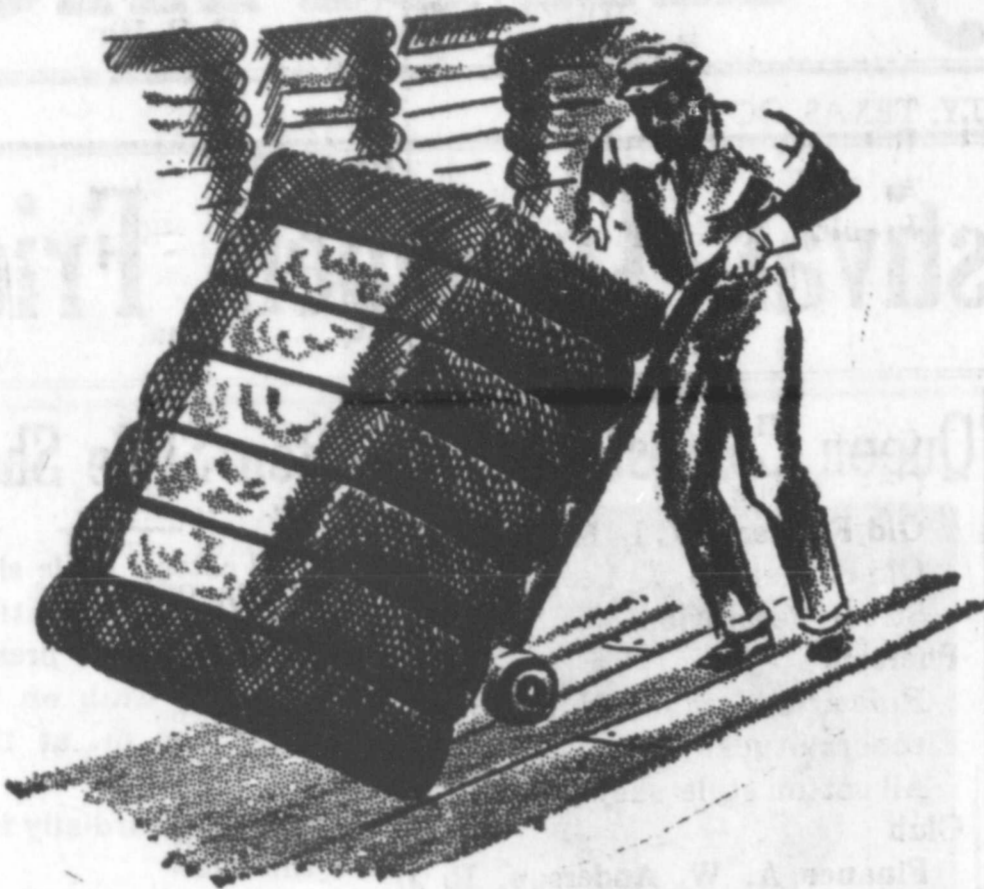
Exhibits

Soil Bank Payments

Approximately 95% of all the soil bank payments have been made. The remainder of the payments will be made as soon as more appropriations are received.

Cotton Marketing Cards

The cotton marketing cards have been mailed to all eligible producers. Please watch closely for the envelope containing these cards as it is very difficult to get a new card when one is lost.

Loan Rates

The grain sorghum loan rate for 1965 in Donley County is \$1.63 per hundredweight for No. 2 or better grades, less applicable storage and service charges.

The basic loan rate for middling one inch cotton is 28.99 cents.

New Farm Program

As to this date we have no official information on the new farm programs. We are sorry about this since so many of you have inquired concerning the planting of wheat. However, as soon as we have the information, we will pass it on to you.

Cotton Report

The USDA Cotton Classing Office at Memphis, Texas, is open and began receiving samples Monday, Oct. 11, according to information released this week by the Cotton Division's Area Office at Dallas. K. E. Voelkel will be in charge of this seasonal office. This is the seventh season of operation for the Memphis Sub-office, and the fifth season for Mr. Voelkel to be in charge.

Early ginned cotton in the Memphis territory has been classed in Altus. C. E. Cox, in charge of the Altus Office, reports: "The 1965 cotton harvest is getting off to a slow start again this year. Only a little over 1,100 samples have been classed through Oct. 8 for the 58 gins in the Memphis classing territory." More than half of these samples were received during the current week, and the harvest is expected to get under way in earnest within the next week or so.

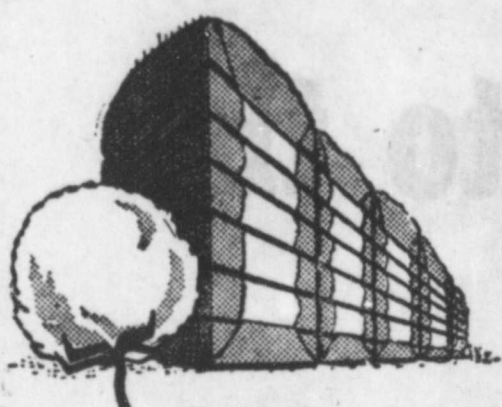

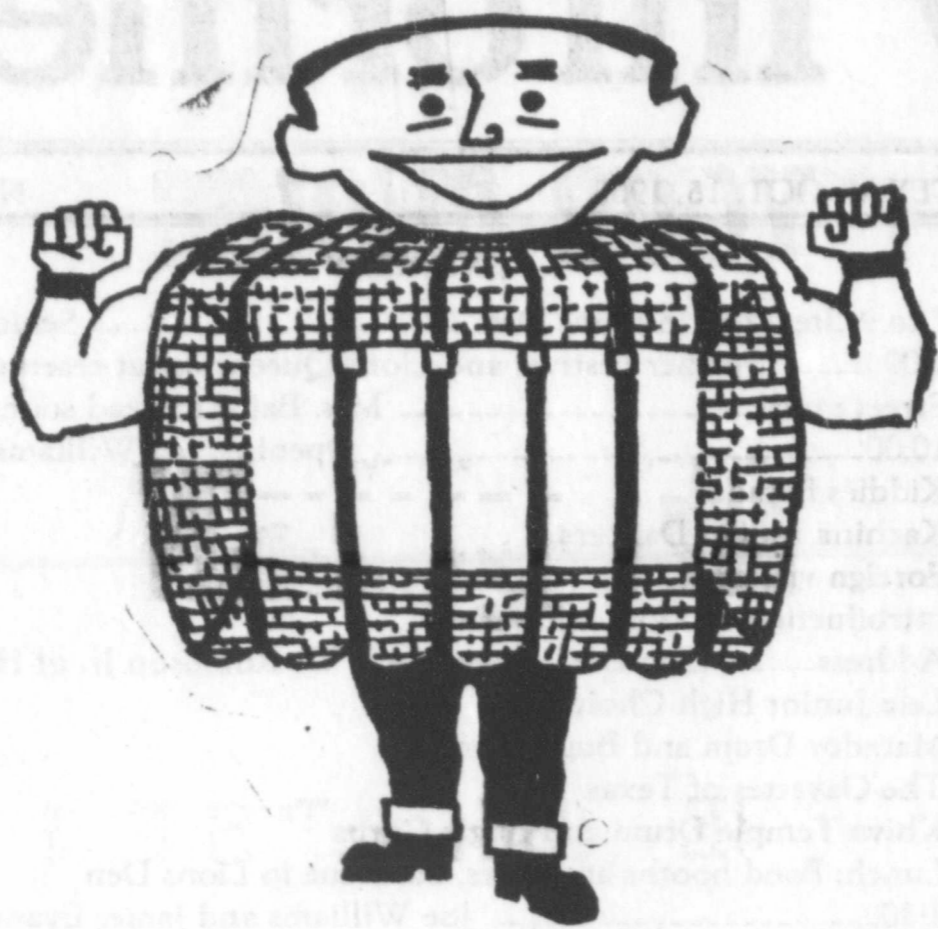

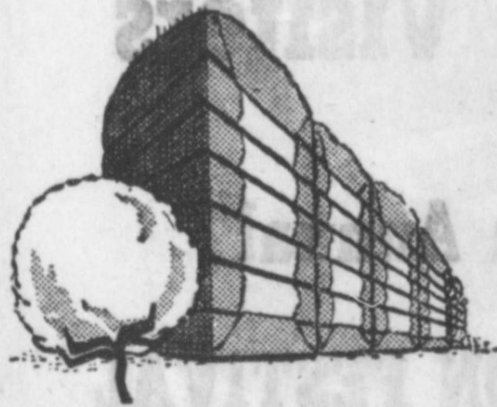

Anyone who will donate a home baked cake is asked to do so for this worthy cause. Please contact Mrs. Bridges if you will furnish a cake.

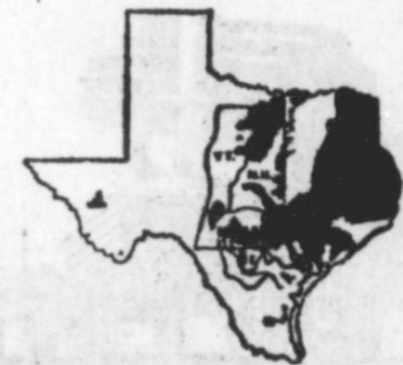

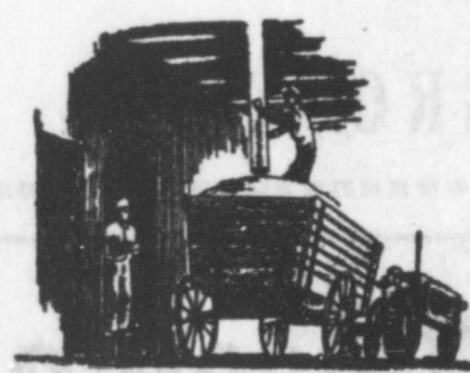
