## Cotton Report

The weather this past week was ideal for maturing the late cotton and it also permitted harvesting to increase in some counties in the Eastern Panhandle. As a result, sample receipts picked up from about 350 to 1000 a day according to the USDA Consumer and Marketing service, Memphis, Tex.

During the week ending Friday, Oct. 29, 4,000 samples were classed for a seasonal total of 7,000. This compared with 9,100 samples as of the same date last year, stated K. E. Voelkel, in charge of the Memphis classing office.

As harvesting increased, the quality of cotton was considerably lower than reported last week. Cotton classed during the week showed 12 percent White; 65 percent Light Spotted; and 23 percent Spotted. The prevailing grade in each of the color groups was: Middling White, 7 percent; Middling Light Spotted, 40 percent; and Middling Spotted, 17 percent.

### Fall Armyworms

Reports coming to Extension entomologists from widespread areas of Texas indicate that fall armyworms are on the increase. Presently, most activity is in the eastern half of the state. The entomologists advise farmers and homeowners to be on the alert for the damaging insects. Young larvae often go unnoticed until they become rather large and have already skeletonized the leaves of the plants under attack. They feed on native and improved grasses small grains, corn, alfalfa, grain sorghums, cowpeas and lawn grasses

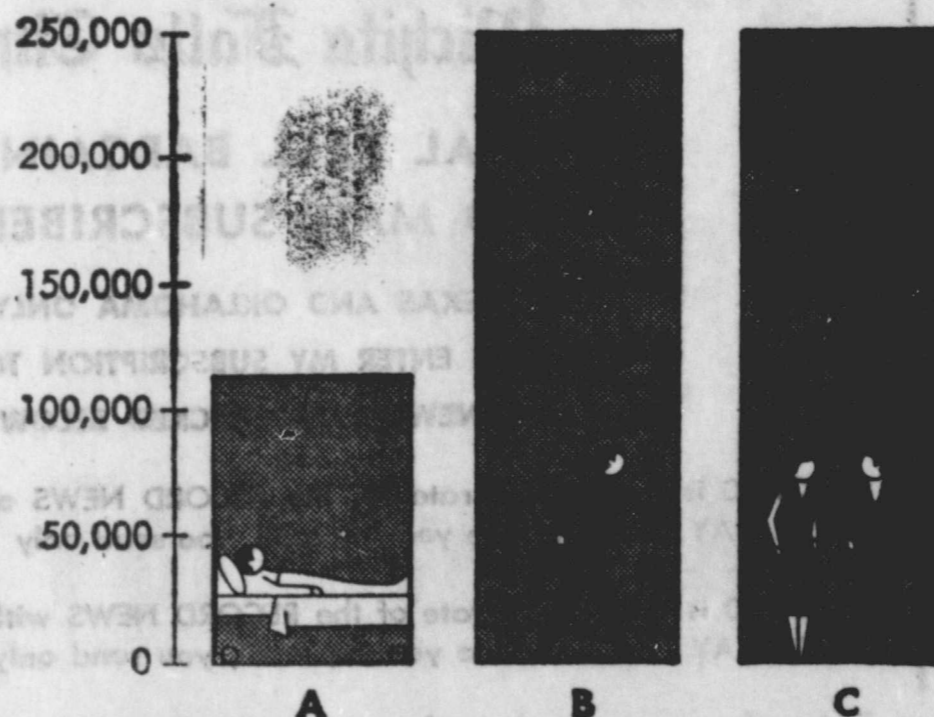

610,000 Americans still have active tuberculosis or are classified as "high risk" individuals.

- A. 110,000 are known to have active tuberculosis.
- B. 250,000 are recently recovered TB patients, many of whom are subject to relapse.
- C. 250,000 are known to have had contact with new active TB cases recently reported.

610,000 persons, all told, are now in the TB picture—either as actively ill patients or in the "high risk" category. Christmas Seal funds help provide the hope and the means of achieving ultimate control and eradication of tuberculosis in the U. S.

With a total of 79 votes cast, the Hedley box rejected every one of the ten proposed amendments Tuesday. The count on the amendments was:

- 1, 25 for, 46 against
- 2, 31 for, 43 against
- 3, 35 for, 40 against
- 4, 12 for, 62 against
- 5, 25 for, 47 against
- 6, 29 for, 42 against
- 7, 18 for, 46 against
- 8, 27 for, 43 against
- 9, 4 for, 65 against
- 10, 4 for, 63 against

Over the state, at press time apparently five of the amendments were carrying. They were Nos. 1, 3, 5, 6 and 8. No. 1 concerned financing college buildings, No. 3 was aid to needy, No. 5 concerned teacher retirement funds, No. 6 was for loans to college students, and No. 8 was on retirement of judges. No. 2, on the veterans land fund, was not definitely decided, but had a majority of about 5 000 against.
