There were 1119 votes cast in Donley County in the college election last Thursday, and the proposal to extend the Clarendon Junior College district to cover the entire county carried by a count of 670 For to 446 Against.

## Mrs. J. Claude Wells

A long time resident of this area, Mrs Pearl Estella Wells, 84, passed away Saturday in a Memphis hospital after a heart attack Friday. She was the wife of J. Claude Wells, co-publisher of The Memphis Democrat.

Funeral services were held Sunday in the First Baptist Church at Memphis by Rev Gene Jorgenson, Rev Richard Avery, and Rev David Hamblin. Burial was in the Memphis cemetery under direction of Spicer Funeral Home.

Mrs Wells was born in Dacula Ga She was married to J. Claude Wells, dean of Panhandle newspapermen, on Oct 31, 1904 in Claude. She and Mr. Wells founded the Hedley Informer in 1910 and lived in Hedley until they sold the Informer to Ed C Boliver in 1917 They were also associated with newspapers in Claude, Texico, N Mex., Hollis, Okla, and Wellington before moving to Memphis in 1925. She had not been active in newspaper work since about 1940

She is survived by her husband and two brothers, Dr. Roy Vineyard of Amarillo and J. O Vineyard of Midland The Wells' only child passed away while they lived in Hedley.

#### 1966 Cotton Program

Any cotton producer in the county may come by the County Office and enter his name on a register indicating his interest in selling or leasing cotton allotments. This information will be made available to anyone interested in this phase of the program and will remain on the counter as public information. Dec 31, 1965 is the last date a producer may file an application for transfer of a cotton allotment either by sale or lease. A Soil Bank farm will be eligible to sell or lease a cotton allotment but this will reduce the soil bank payment rate.

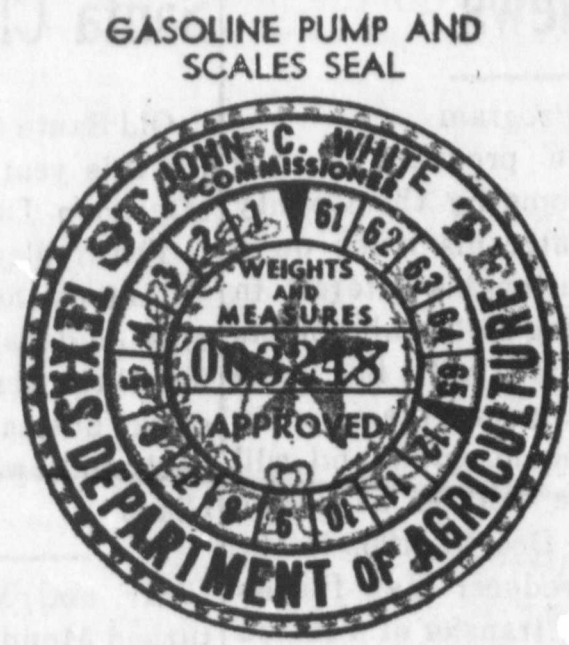
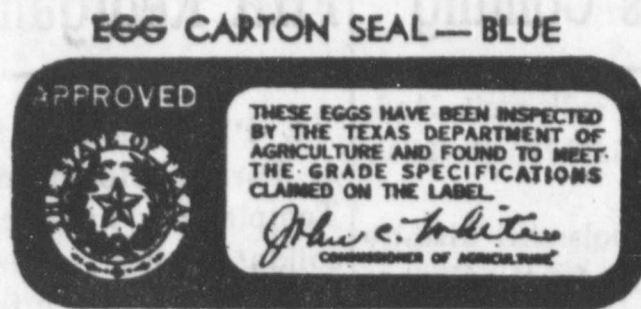

#### Step Up Search for Former 4-H's Who Qualify for Alumni Awards

The Federal Extension Service estimates that there are 23 million former 4-H Club members in the United States today. So it is safe to say that in each of the nearly 3,100 counties and districts within the 50 states reside thousands of men and women who were 4-H's. It is these people whom the national 4-H alumni program seeks to honor locally and nationally through its recognition awards. The program is conducted by the Extension Service and supported by the Olin Mathieson Chemical Corporation. Participants sought are persons who have demonstrated leadership, service to youth, adherence to 4-H principles and success in their occupation or profession.

Businessmen, homemakers, farmers, teachers, public officials and others have received alumni awards during the 13 years they have been offered. The main task, according to the National 4-H Service Committee which cooperates in the program, is to make a concentrated effort to keep in touch with former 4-H members. Names of persons can be sent to the National 4-H Service Committee.

If every county from coast to coast named four persons to receive the county alumni recognition pin, more than 12,000 could be honored in a single year. And 200 could be cited for the state plaque award. Then there are eight national key award recipients to be selected from among the state winners. These eight are guests of Olin during the National 4-H Club Congress at Chicago. An elaborate alumni banquet and other recognition events spotlight the national winners.

"With so much good being done by so many who have shared a common philosophy of service to others and who attained success in life," observed Mr. Kenneth Anderson, associate director of the National 4-H Service Committee, "it's important that these responsible Americans be honored."

He urges residents to check childhood affiliations of prominent neighbors to ascertain if they have a 4-H background. "If so, make him or her your 1966 candidate," he added. "Ways to locate 4-H alumni are at large meetings, local affairs, clubs, church and by just asking around."

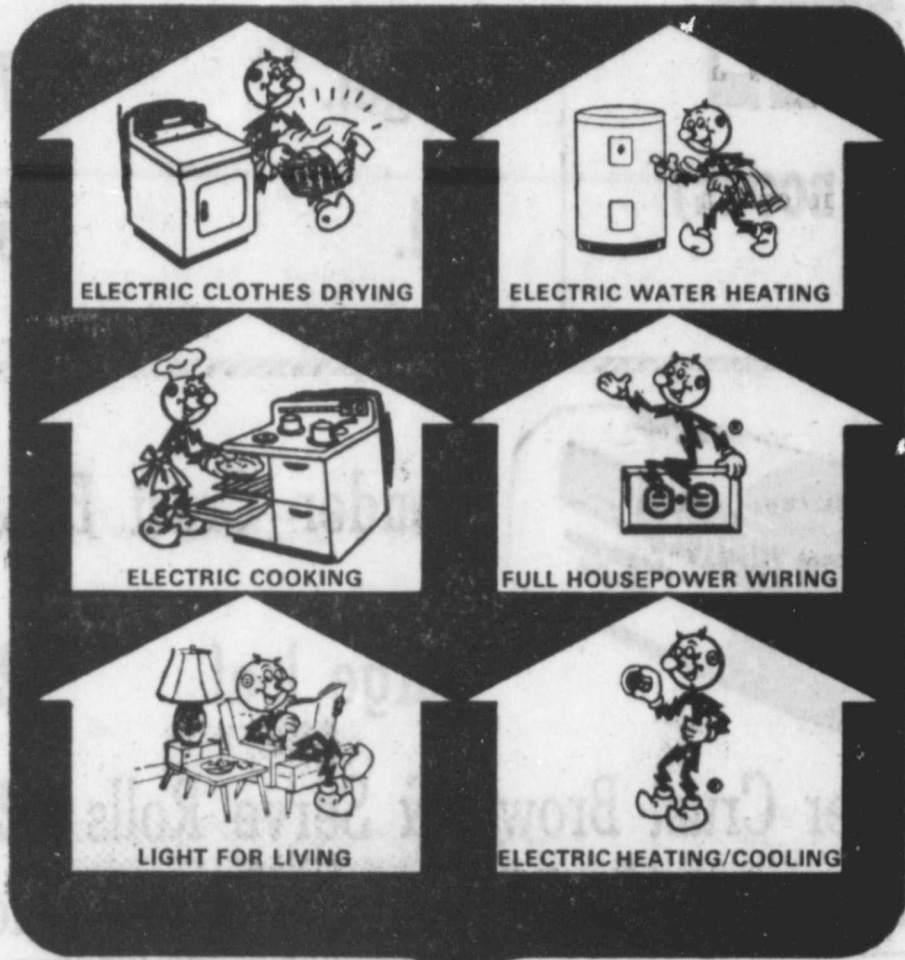

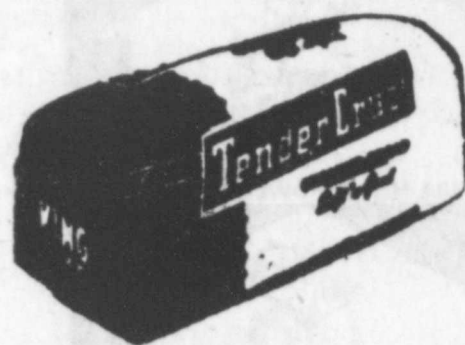
