

A long time resident of this area, Mrs Pearl Estella Wells, 84 passed away Saturday in a Memphis hospital after a heart attack Friday. She was the wife of J Claude Wells, co-publisher of The Memphis Democrat.

Funeral services were held Sun day in the First Baptist Church a Memphis by Rev Gene Jorgenson Rev Richard Avery, and Rev David Hamblin. Burial was in the Memphis cemetery under direction of Spicer Funeral Home.

Mrs Wells was born in Dacula Ga She was married to J. Claude Wells, dean of Panhandle newspapermen, on Oct 31, 1904 in Claude. She and Mr. Wells founded the Hedley Informer in 1910 and lived in Hedley until they sold the Informer to Ed C Boliver in 1917 They were also associated with newspapers in Claude, Texico, N Mex., Hollis, Okla, and Wellington before moving to Memphis in 1925. She had not been active in newspaper work since about 1940

She is survived by her husband and two brothers, Dr. Roy Vineyard of Amarillo and J. O Vineyard of Midland The Wells' only child passed away while they lived in Hedley.


#### FHA Reorganized


#### Price Appointed






