The Texas Highway Patrol in westigated 3 accidents on rural highways in Donley County during the month of December, according to Sergeant J W Wilson, Highway Patrol supervisor of this area.

The rural traffic accident summary for this county for the calendar year of 1965 shows a total of 60 crashes resulting in no persons killed, 13 injured, and an estimated property damage of \$35,518 00

Six of the 31 counties in the THP's Amarillo district had no traffic fatalities in 1965. These were Briscoe, Donley, Foard, Hansford, Lipscomb, and Sherman but 90 persons were injured and property damage reached \$156,448 in automobile accidents during the year.
