## Accident Report

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 3 accidents on rural highways in Donley County during the month of December, according to Sergeant J W Wilson, Highway Patrol supervisor of this area.

The rural traffic accident summary for this county for the calendar year of 1965 shows a total of 60 crashes resulting in no persons killed, 13 injured, and an estimated property damage of \$35,518 00

Six of the 31 counties in the TBP's Amarillo district had no traffic fatalities in 1965. These were Briscoe, Donley, Foard, Hansford, Lipscomb, and Sherman but 90 persons were injured and property damage reached \$156,448 in automobile accidents during the year.

People 65 or over need to be reminded they do not have much longer to enroll in the Medicare program under social security, according to Hal Geldon, Manager of the Amarillo Social Security office.

The enrollment period began September 1, 1965, and will end March 31, 1966. Persons who were 65 or older in 1965, must sign up during this enrollment period if they want the supplemental medical insurance.

People who are receiving social security or railroad retirement benefits have received their enrollment card by mail. Persons receiving old age assistance benefits from the Texas Department of Public Welfare will be contacted by their welfare office. Others who have not signed up for either of these benefits should contact their Amarillo social security office now for assistance in enrolling.

## Cotton Report

As cotton harvesting entered the scapping stage, the downward trend in the quality of Eastern Panhandle cotton continued, according to the USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service in Memphis, Texas. The brightest spot in this report is the continued high Pressley test of the cotton classed from this territory.

K E. Voelkel, in charge of the Memphis classing office, stated that the eight classers assigned to the office classed 27,000 samples during the week ending Friday, January 14. This brings the total for the season to 177,000. As of the same date a year ago 162,000 samples had been classed, and the total for the 1964-65 season amounted to 167,000. It is estimated that 85 to 90 percent of the expected production has been classed so far.

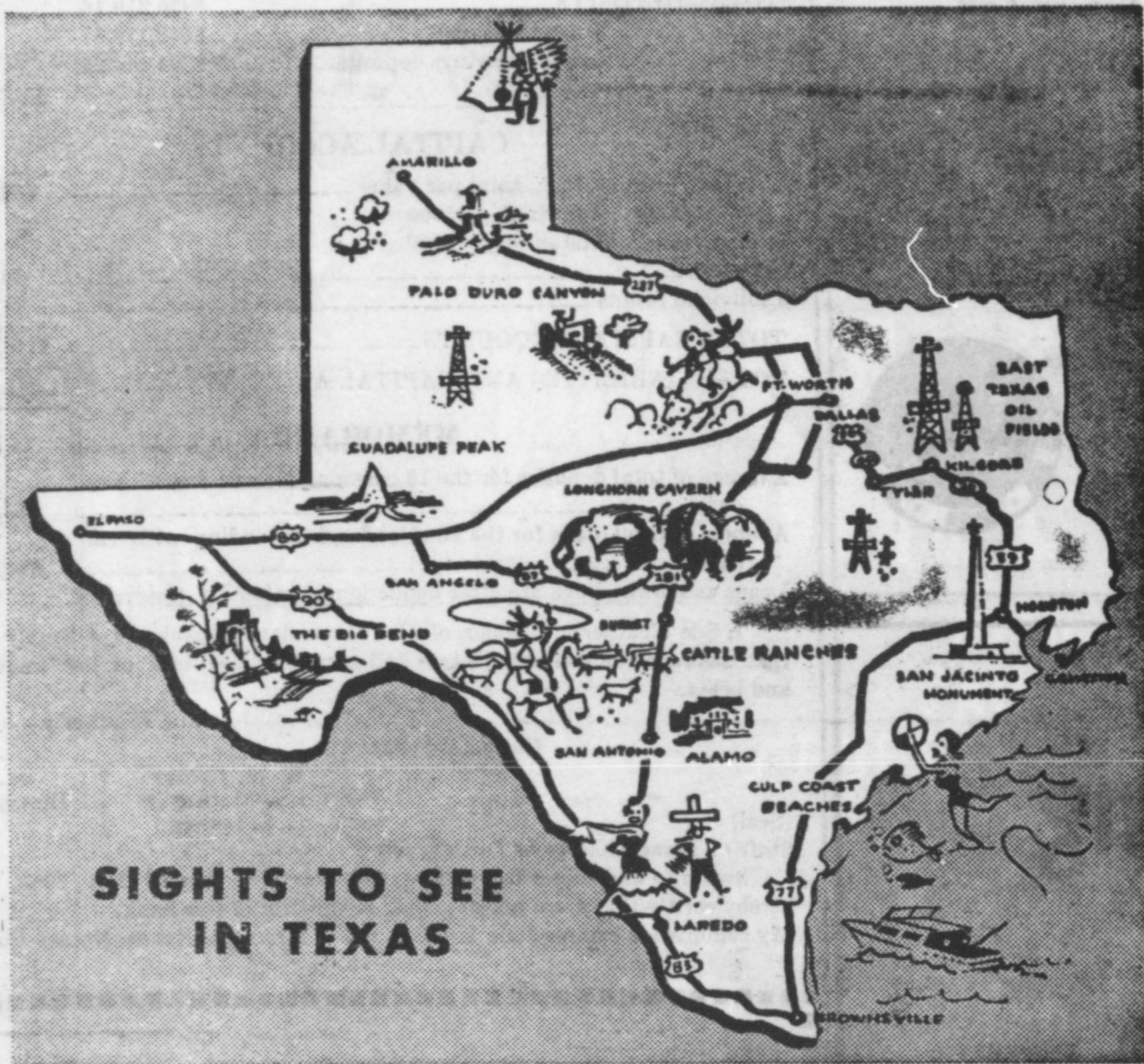

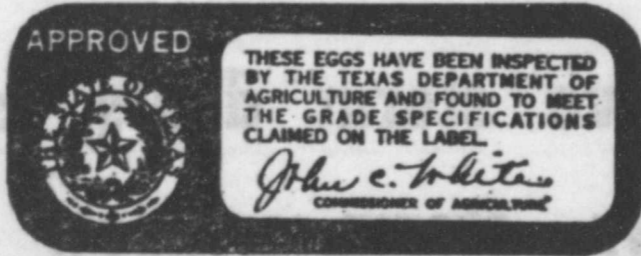

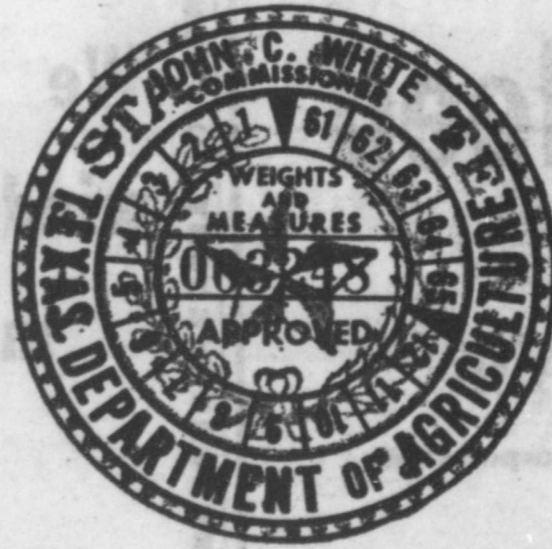
