## Jamie Evans To Receive State Honors

Jamie Evans daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Evans, has been notified by the Area I FHA degree chairman that her application for a state FHA degree of achievement has been approved by the evaluating committee. She will be recognized, with other chapter members of Area I, at the Area I FHA meeting in Amarillo on Saturday, March 19. She will receive the certificate of achievement at the state FHA meeting in San Antonio April 29-30.

The state degree of achievement is the highest honor awarded by the FHA organization to a high school girl. To be eligible for this honor, a girl must be above average in character and in scholastic standing. She must be recommended as qualified by the FHA Advisor and school officials. She must have completed four semesters of homemaking instruction and be an active member of an affiliated chapter of FHA.

In addition to these requirements she must have earned chapter and junior degrees of achievement and must have shown more than average growth in several areas of living during her high school years. She must have chosen worthwhile goals and shown evidence of growth in each of these areas; (1) as an individual, (2) as member of her school, (3) as a community member, (4) as a family member, (5) as an FHA chapter member and has helped her community to understand the goals of the homemaking program.

The degree application itself was a detailed record of all work that Jamie has done and activities in which she has participated during her four years of high school. A great deal of meticulous work is necessary in the preparation of the degree material, which Jamie has done very satisfactorily.

This will be the first FHA degree of achievement to be awarded a Hedley High School girl in many years. There is no known evidence that such honors have ever been awarded before to a Hedley girl.

We of the Hedley school and especially of the FHA chapter are very happy and extremely proud of Jamie's work as a chapter member. She is at present serving the chapter as president. We feel

## Greenbelt Dam

A total of 106 contractors from 12 states have asked for specifications to bid on the construction of the Greenbelt dam 4 miles north of Clarendon, including the filter plant, pipe lines from Lake Creek to the dam site, from the dam site to Clarendon and from Quanah to Crowell. The bids will be opened at the county courthouse in Clarendon Tuesday, March 29th.

Also bids are being accepted and will be opened at the same place and date from banks who wish to act as depository for Greenbelt funds. The funds will amount to something in excess of four million dollars.

## Voter Registration

Attorney General Waggoner Carr advises that all persons who were subject to paying poll tax during the period which ended on January 31, 1966, in order to be qualified to vote in the 1966 elections, but who did not pay a poll tax or obtain a "poll tax not paid" for voting in federal elections, should now register. The registration period began March 3 and ends March 17. This must be done at the tax office in the county courthouse.

Persons who already have a poll tax receipt, a receipt stamped "poll tax not paid" (for voting in federal elections) or those who have received an exemption certificate should not register.

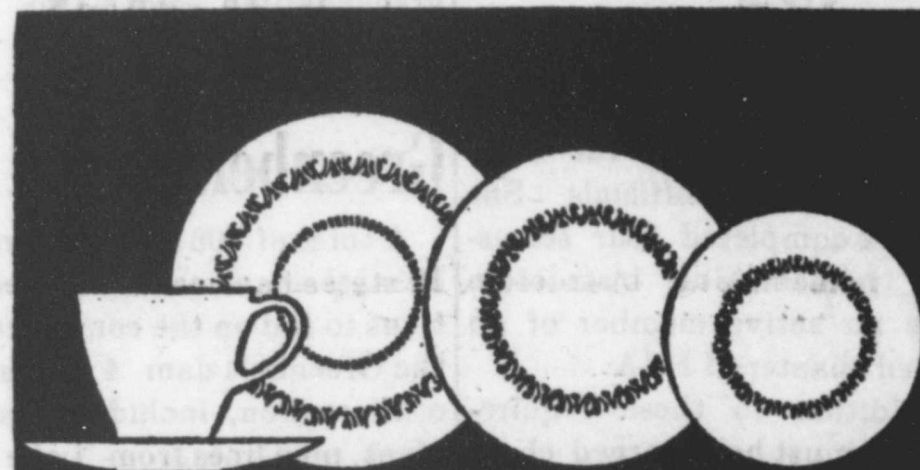

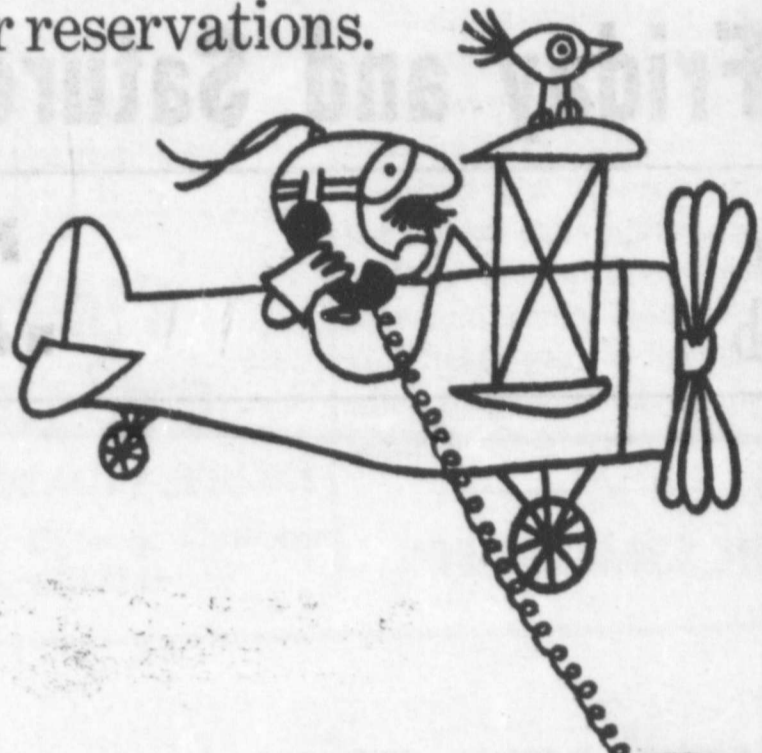

**Medicare Program**

Postmaster Davis of Hedley announced today that application blanks for supplemental Medicare benefits are available at the window of the Hedley post office.

The application blanks are being made available as the Social Security Administration seeks to contact 3 1 million senior citizens before a March 31 deadline imposed by the Medicare law.

The supplemental program costs \$3 a month and provides doctor bill and other benefits Everyone over 65 is eligible for the basic hospital benefits under Medicare.

Senior citizens who reached 65 before 1966 face a two year delay if they do not sign up by March 31. The application forms are preaddressed to the Social Security Administration in Baltimore, Maryland

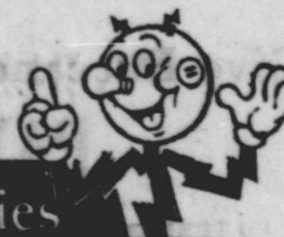
