





The application blanks are being made available as the Social Security Administration seeks to contact 3 1 million senior citizens before a March 31 deadline imposed by the Medicare law


The supplemental program costs \$3 a month and provides doctor bill and other benefits Everyone over 65 is eligible for the basic hospital benefits under Medicare. Senior citizens who reached 65 before 1966 face a two year delay if they do not sign up by March 31. The application forms are preaddressed to the Social Security Administration in Baltimore, Maryland




