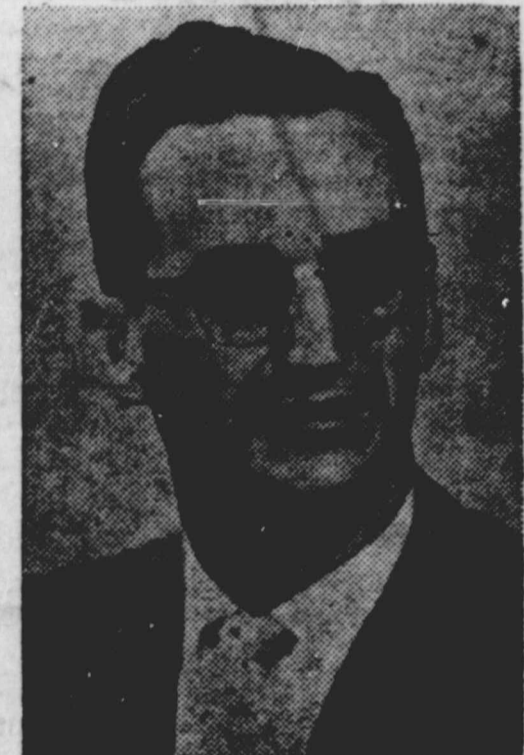
Flower Show
