More College Funds

The Office of Education of the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Washington, D. C. announced on April 1 the approval of funds for the Federal College Work-Study Program for the fiscal year of July 1, 1966-June 30, 1967.

Clarendon College received an allotment of \$43,665 from the program which was created under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, according to Mr Vaughan President of the college This figure represents more than a 100% increase over last year and will open up some sixty to seventy jobs for students at the college. Job categories range from office and secretarial personnel to that of maintenance and grounds, both on campus and off campus Applications are now being taken for both summer and fall job openings Students who wish to work while attending college should write or call:
