The Hedley box tallied 228 votes in the first primary election Saturday. In state races, incumbents were generally favored. Of more local interest, totals included:

For state representative, J. M. Simpson 117 and Warren Zimmerman 66; for county treasurer, Mrs. Nina Dale 103, Mrs. Yvonne King 97 and Mrs. T. W. McAnear 17; for county school supt. Maurice Risley 79, J. C. Stepp 75, Bill Todd 56 and Willard Edgett 8; for precinct chairman Henry Moore 134 and R. W. Seales 87.

Over the county Mrs. Dale was elected treasurer with 788 votes, Mrs. King 461 and Mrs. McAnear 102. There will be a runoff in the school supt. race, with Bill Todd receiving 483 votes, Risley 399, Stepp 275 and Edgett 187. We are unofficially informed that R. W. Seales was elected precinct chairman by 10 votes.

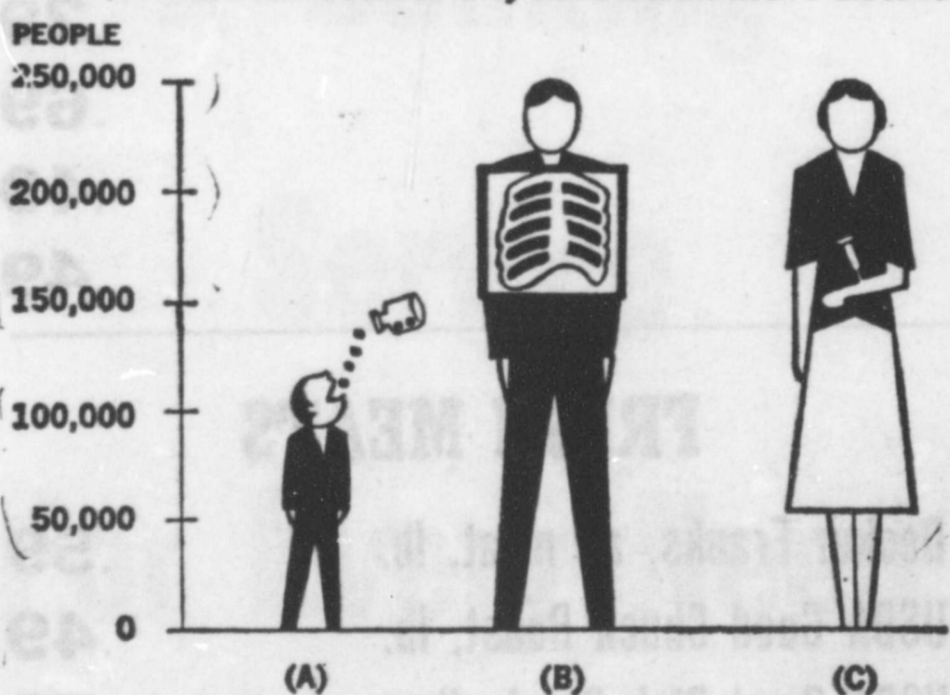

- (C) 250,000 live closely with people with newly discovered active disease.
