## J. M. Baker Retires

A special honor was given at the Hedley commencement to J. M. Baker, who retired following this year's school term after 49 years in the teaching profession. He was given a standing ovation, and was presented a beautiful watch, suitably engraved in token of his 49 years of service.

Mr. Baker began teaching in Bryan County, Oklahoma, in 1916, and taught ten years in that county. He attended Southeastern State Teachers College at Durant, Okla., and worked in that college for two years. He attended North Texas State University at Denton two summer terms, and one summer term at Abilene Christian College. He received his BS degree from West Texas State at Canyon with a major in social sciences and a first minor in mathematics, and also worked on his master's degree there.

He came to Texas in 1926 and taught four years at Eli in Hall County. He came to Donley County in 1930, taught five years at Giles, then went to Smith and taught five years, then came back to Giles and taught three more years. He came to Hedley in 1944.

Mr. Baker states that it has been an honor and a pleasure to teach in the Hedley schools these many years, and that everyone has been so nice that his time here has been very pleasant.

The Bakers will continue to live in Hedley, and no doubt fishing, gardening, and visiting their children will occupy a great part of their time.
