### Cotton Referendum

The ballots cast in the 1966 Upland Cotton Referendum were counted at 10:00 a. m. in the front office of the USDA Building. Results were as follows:

Number voting in favor of transfers, 135

Number voting against transfers, 316.

Total acceptable ballots, 451.

This is of course, a two-thirds majority voting against transferring cotton allotments outside of the county for the 1967 crop year. Diverted Acres and Crop Measurements

We cannot impress on you producers too much how important it is for you to fully realize your responsibility on certification. This year is Donley County's first year for farmer certification. Be careful in your measurements before reporting your acres, watch for final dates for reporting your acreages as loss of program benefits would result for failure to file timely reports as well as accurate reports. We will help you any way we can in the office to determine the acreages by your measurements. Don't forget we have available the measuring service for you after your crops are planted and up if you request it and pay for the service.

## Hedley Will Decide

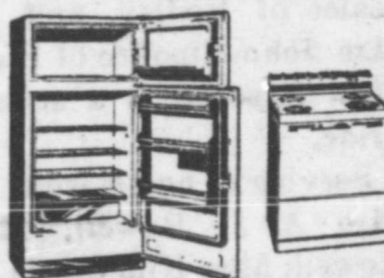

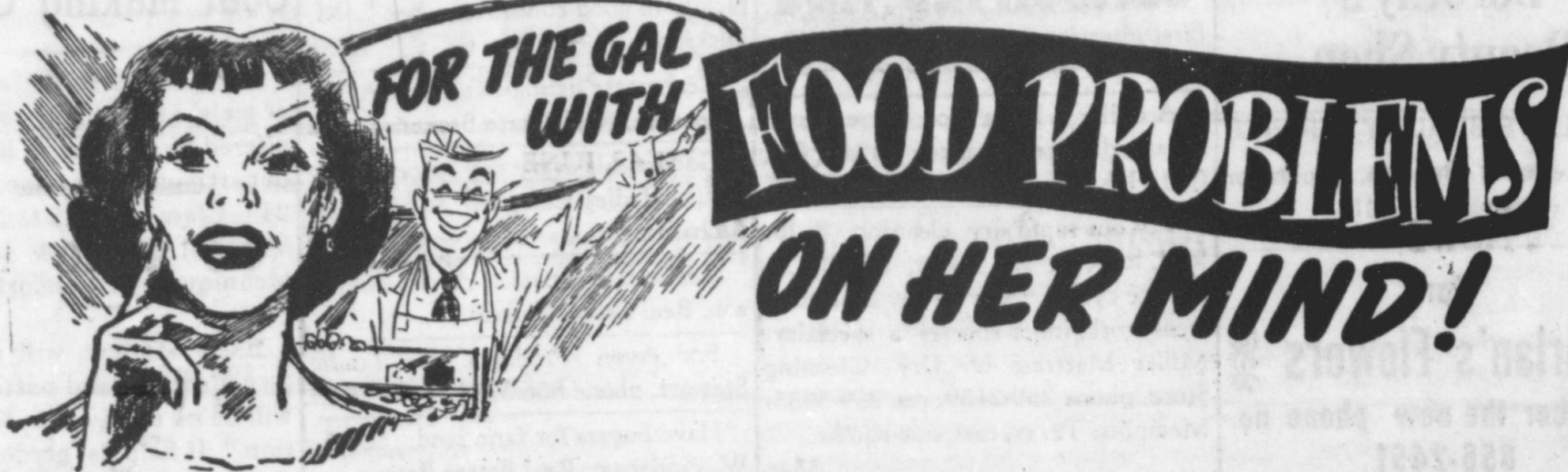
